

William was a commissary officer in the Continental Army of North Carolina. (He wants information on other Alford ancestors who were in the Revolutionary War.)

We are pleased to send you this first full size ABOUT ALFORDS. Each quarter the newsletter will range in size from 20 to 26 pages. Although some types of material will appear in each issue, we will attempt to keep it varied, interesting and useful. We depend on you to give us feedback telling us what you like and what you don't like. Speaking of feedback, we have found that we are prone to err. Please point out our mistakes so that we can publish corrections in subsequent issues. It is certainly not our purpose to mislead any reader in the slightest.

If you are reluctant to have your name, or information pertaining to you, appear in print you should advise us. Copies of the newsletter will be made available to various societies and columnists. The Library of Congress has also requested that we furnish copies for their gift and exchange section files.

Lodwick and his family havetaken such more than their share of this issue. We will normally not devote more than about four pages to any one person or family. An exception needed to be made this time.

Beginning in the next issue and continuing in subsequent issues will be a section on Alford cansus. We will tell and show you more about it in the next issue.

Included in this issue is a lineage table, to the extent data was available, on all of the ALFS. In each future issue we will include this information on the new ALFS in the Alford Exchange.

In each issue as part of the Alford Exchange we will give the address of new ALFS. We will discontinue the directory as such and will publish separately an annual directory that gives the name, address, and lineage of all the ALFS. We will announce its availability and price when they are ready.

In each future issue we will publish at least one page of data from our basic data file. It was not included in this issue because of Lodwick.

We still want to emphasize our early ancestors, 1700's and before, in a future issue. We would like for you to send us as such information as you can on any and all Alfords of that period. We will not include this in the next couple of issues as we are awaiting receipt of a special listing we hope will be useful. We may find it worthwhile to establish "Early Ancestors" as a section in each issue.

Each issue will include one or more family charts like those used with Lodwick in this issue. If you have any special branch of the family you would like to see charted, let us hear from you.

One of our contacts in another line has requested that we include more information about computers/computing in our newsletter. We will have a page "Computing Cousins" which will relate to those with computers in all our lines/newsletters. If you have a computer please send us information on the hardware and software you have and how you use it for genealogy.

For our effort to be successful, we need to be in contact with as many ALFS as possible and to collect as much data as we can on Alfords. If you know of others who are interested in Alford family history and genealogy tell them about us, or better yet, tell us about them. We contact every potential ALF which you mention to us.

We have been surprised and disappointed about the absence of books on Alford history. Sure, there are books that include a page or two, or maybe a chapter on Alford, but where are those devoted entirely to the family. We have found them in our other lines, some of which are not nearly as popular as Alford. If you know of publications, partially or exclusively devoted to Alford history please tell us about them, and if possible give us a source from which to buy the book, borrow it, or have it copied.
