In "Alford Hall of Fame, 1996 and 1997," you'll see that I am dedicating the 1999 Texas meeting to D.L. Alford Jr., AAFA #0054. I sincerely believe that had it not been for him you would not be reading this because AAFA would not have survived.

In the previous issue we provided you with the latest information on the nominees to be elected to the board in October. Once elected by the membership, the board must then elect officers (president, vicepresident, secretary and treasurer) for the coming year. That election of officers comes during a short break in the Saturday morning

Currently, the entire Texas Alford marriage list is posted there!

Our continual hollering for help has gotten some response, for which we are most thankful. However, the amount of work that needs to be done to maintain the high standards that AAFA has enjoyed over the years far exceeds the amount of help we have. We still need folks to do computer input, but the most critical need at this time is for folks to help manage different parts of the program. It would take too much space to explain it all here but if you are seriously interested just let me know. You'll find all my numbers on page two.

By the time you are reading this, I expect Ramona Alford Darden, AAFA #0715, and her meetings committee will have selected the city and hotel where we will meet in Georgia in 2000. At last report Atlanta, Savannah, and Augusta were all still in the race. I imagine that they have now moved their attention to North Carolina to prepare for the 2001 meeting. Maybe it will be in the vicinity of the Leslie-Alford-Mims House described in this issue. Perhaps our patriarch, Wick Alford, AAFA #0011, could arrange a special tour for AAFA. Funeral rites were held Friday, January 11 at the First Baptist Church for L.E. Alford who died suddenly at his home on North Manvel Tuesday afternoon....

Men who served as pallbearers were Bill Stadler, Bill Roberts, Walter Mathis, Homer Sudheimer, Virgil Rowlan and Will Rogers. Interment was in the New Zion Cemetery.

L.E. Alford was born July 22, 1890, near Owensboro, Ky., and departed this life at his home in Chandler January 8, 1946, at the age of 55 years, 5 months and 7 days.

In 1906 the family moved to Oklahoma settling near Anadarko in Caddo Co., moving to Lincoln County in 1911. On October 27, 1912, he was united in marriage with Louie Sallie Harris [sic] and to this union nine children were born; four infant children who preceded their father in death; Otis Doyle of Salinas, Calif.; Mrs. Aletha Standall, also of Salinas; Mrs. La Vonne Dyer of Chandler; and Fay and L.E. Jr. of the home address.

From the farm where the first home was established, Mr. Alford accepted employment in the oil field at the opening of the Davenport field in 1924, following the oil field work as a profession nearly 22 years.

As a young man, Mr. Alford united with the Methodist church, transferring his membership to the Union Friends church where he remained a member to the time of his death. He was a regular attendant at the services of the Baptist church.

Lon Alford was a faithful husband and a loving father who lived for his home and his family. He was a substantial citizen and his friendly, kindly disposition made and kept for him a large circle of friends who were shocked and grieved at his untimely passing.

Survivors in addition to the wife and five children

include two brothers: Gus of San Diego, Calif., and C.E. of Chandler; four sisters, Mrs. A.M. Wright, and Mrs. E.B. Mattingly, both of San Diego; Mrs. F.C. Boyd of Hawsville, Ky., and Mrs. H.A. Snodgrass of Chicago, Ill.; two half-brothers, Walter Conrad of Chandler and J.C. Alford of Owensboro, Ky.; one half-sister, Mrs. Wilbur Reeks of Crescent City, Fla.; and three grandchildren, Edward Doyle, Donaleta and Vonna Lou Alford of Salinas, Calif.

John married (1) about 1860 in KY?, ¹³ **Agnes Jane** "**Jennie**" **Cruse**, born 1835, Marion Co., KY, ¹⁴ died by 1879, Daviess Co., KY¹⁵

August 1852 is given as Laura's birth date in 1900 census. She married (1) James S. Conrad at Mattoon, IL, on Aug. 27, 1873. They had 2 children—Edgar E. Conrad (Aug. 19, 1874–Dec. 12, 1874) and Walter Finley Conrad (Oct. 15, 1875–Jan. 25, 1966). James Conrad died Aug. 16, 1876. Son Walter was living with John and Laura in the 1880 census and went with them to OK in 1905. Marriage and birth dates of Conrad children from family Bible.

The family of John and Laura seems to have gone to OK around 1905. Laura's son Walter Conrad went also. On the 1910 census, they were enumerated in Caddo Co., OK; in 1920 they were in Chandler, Lincoln Co., OK.

Word has been received here of the death of Mrs. Laura Alford, 81 years old, on February 21, at Chandler Okla. She was the widow of the late J.H. Alford, formerly of Daviess county. She is survived by eight children, Walter Conrad, a son by a former marriage, Cleve and Lon Alford of Chandler; Mrs. Olive Snodgrass, of Oklahoma City; Mrs. Pearl Wright, Mrs. Emma Mattingly and Gus Alford of San Diego, Calif., and Mrs. Frank (Lula) Boyd, of Hawesville, Ky.; also three stepchildren, J. Crit and J.W. Alford, of Owensboro and Mrs. Wilbur Ricks of Jacksonville, Fla. Funeral services were

conducted from the Chandler Methodist Church Friday afternoon with interment in Chandler cemetery.

16. **Joseph Alford** born 1812, probably Casey Co., KY, ¹⁶ married about 1837 in KY, ¹⁷ **Mary "Polly"** _____, born 1814, KY, ¹⁸ died about 1870–80, Daviess Co., KY. ¹⁹ Joseph died 1870–80, Daviess Co., KY. ²⁰ First appearance of Joseph in the KY Census indexes is Marion Co. in 1850. Family seems to have been in Marion Co. in 1840s according to KY tax lists. Were there older children not accounted for in the 1850 census?

3rd Great-Grandparents

32. **Achilles Alford** born about 1772, VA or NC,²¹ married (2) Jul 19 1810 in Casey Co., KY,²² **Tabitha Lane**, born about 1785, the daughter of **Daniel Lane**. Achilles died Aug __ 1830, Danville, Casey Co., KY.²³

Achilles married (1) Nov 14 1795 in Rutherford Co., NC,²⁴ Elizabeth "Betsy" Jones, died about 1807, Rutherford Co., NC.

Achilles was killed in a duel. It was probably he who was enumerated in 1810 Casey County as Pellicies Alford—just he and wife. In 1820 Casey County it was likely he as Kildess Olford in 1830 as Archiballes age 50–60 with wife age 40–50 and daughters: 2 under 5, 2 age 5–10 and 2 10–15. When he married the second time his name was listed as Archilleus. He is sometimes listed as Halford or Hallford. Orville Alford AAFA #390 connects him as son of John—need proof.

4th Great-Grandparents

64. **John Alford, Sr.** born before 1750, possibly VA,²⁵ possibly married **Lucy Bradley**, born before 1755,²⁶ died after 1810.²⁷ John died about 1800, Rutherford Co., NC. He was sometimes shown as Halford and Allford. Orville Alford AAFA #390 shows him as a possible son of James Alford born 1713 in Fluvanna Co., VA. The Rutherford Co., NC 1790 census for John indicated a household of 4 males over 16, 4 males under 16 and 5 females.

Barbourville, Knox Co.

John is found on the following censuses: 1850 KY Knox Co., age 12, born KY; 1860 KY Knox 21 __; 1870 KY Whitley 30 KY; 1880 Knox KY 45; 1900 Knox KY 61. Who were the parents of his 3 year old granddaughter Sadie enumerated with the family in 1900?

After John's death, Elizabeth is found on the following censuses: 1910 KY Knox Co., age 63 widow; 1920 KY Knox 73 enumerated as mother of Thomas D. Alford.

3rd Great-Grandparents

32. John Alford (Achilles², John¹) born Apr __ 1806, Rutherford Co., NC,6 married Jan 12 1826 in Rutherford Co., NC,7 Diarissa Lunsford, born about 1806, NC, the daughter of Daniel Lunford and Margaret Dornbush. Diarissa died before 1880, Knox Co., KY. John died after 1880, Knox Co., KY.8

Jones Bradley was bondsman with John on his marriage and may have been kin through John's father Achilles Alford's mother Lucy Bradley.

In NC John was usually called "Halford" but in KY he was never called "Halford." John is found on the following censuses: 1850 KY Knox Co., age 43, born NC; 1860 KY Knox 53 NC; 1870 ???; 1888 KY Knox 76 NC. AAFA has copies of four land records 1845–1860.

For the lineage of Achilles² and John¹, see their records for member #1031 earlier in this article.

Wessylyne is/was a member of the Society of Professors of Education, Mid Western Regional Director 1986–1990; a life member of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority; Kappa Delta Pi International Honor Society in Education; National Sorority of Phi Delta Kappa (Education) and was charter member of Epsilon Epsilon Chapter.

Matthew married (2) 1893 in Webster Co., MS, **Minnie Jennings**, born about 1876, died 1925.

On the 1870 MS census in Oktibbeha County Matthew was enumerated in the Littleberry household as "Martin" age 10 MU [mulatto] born MS.

Matthew and Lucy had four children who survived. One boy and one girl died as infants.

8. Solomon B. Alford born Jun ___ 1828, Greene Co., AL, married (2) Lussie "Lucy" Alford, born about 1835, NC, died about 1883, Webster Co., MS. Solomon died about 1907, Webster Co., MS. Both buried: Mt. Pisgah Cem. Wesbster Co., MS. In the Civil War, Solomon served in Company H 31st MS Infantry, CSA.

Solomon married (1) _____ Coffey.

Lussie was born into slavery. Wessylyne shows her born in NC but the 1870 census shows AL. Lussie and Solomon had six children.

At Solomon's request, he and Lussie are buried together in the Mt. Pisgah Cemetery. Though he and Lussie/Lucy lived as man and wife, it is doubtful if they were ever formally married. It was probably against the law in MS at that time.

Solomon appears on the following censuses: 1850 MS Oktibbeha Co., age 22, born AL; 1860 MS Oktibbeha 32 AL; 1870 MS Oktibbeha 47 AL; 1900 MS Webster 72 AL. In 1900 his 68 year old sister "Nancy Bury" was with him.

Great-Grandparents

16. **Littleberry B. Alford** born about 1801, NC,² married Jan 3 1822 in Wake Co., NC,³ **Mary "Polly" Butler**, born about 1801, NC,² died about 1900, MS. They were married as Berry and Polly and the bondsman was John Butler. Littleberry died about 1878, probably in Oktibbeha Co., MS.

They appear on the following censuses: 1850 MS Oktibbeha Co, age 49 for both, Berry born NC/Polly born NC; 1860 MS Oktibbeha 59 NC/AL; 1870 MS Oktibbeha 69 NC/NC.

It is supposed that Littleberry and Mary departed NC for Greene Co., AL about 1823 where they lived until about 1840, when they moved to MS. Information to prove that is needed.

Samuel Neaman Alford born May 6 1870, Johnson Station, Pike Co., MS, married Sep 6 1899 in Jackson, East Feliciana Parish, LA, Lillian Edna de la Garza, born Jan 25 1875, Clinton, East Feliciana Parish, LA, the daughter of John de la Garza and Mary Anna Westley Waller. She died Dec 12 1963, Bergstrom Air Force Base, Texas, buried: Brookhaven, Lincoln Co., MS. Samuel died Feb 15 1937, Brookhaven, Lincoln Co., MS.

Great-Grandparents

12. Seaborn John Alford born Oct 11 1807, Washington Parish, LA, occupation Farmer & Minister, married (2) Dec 8 1864 in Amite Co., MS, Mary Sessions Kirk, born Jan 29 1836, TN, died Sep 1 1887, Pike Co., MS, buried: John Felders Cemetery, Pike Co., MS. Mary had one daughter by a previous marriage to Rev Daniel M. Wadsworth. She and Seaborn John had their last child when he was 69 years of age.

Seaborn also married (1) Dec 29 1831, probably in

Pike Co., MS, **Mary Catherine Felder**, born Sep 23 1813, Pike Co., MS,⁵ died Nov 23 1860, Pike Co., MS, buried: John Felders Cemetery, Pike Co., MS.

Seaborn (whose twin brother was named John Seaborn Alford) died Feb 7 1884, Pike Co., MS, buried: John Felders Cemetery, Pike Co., MS. Some of Tressie Bowman's family group sheets showed him as born in Amite Co., MS. That county was not established until 1809. Nevertheless we have found no evidence that his father Jacob ever lived in Amite County though he probably did own some land there. The family, after leaving Georgia about 1807, came to what was then Spanish West Florida. Their first record in Louisiana shows them in St. Tammany Parish, and then later in Washington Parish, right on the MS line.

Seaborn was one of several of Jacob's sons who moved to MS. He was enumerated in the 1850 Census in Pike Co., MS with first wife Mary C. and his first five children. His birthplace is listed as Louisiana, and he is listed as a farmer.

He was enumerated in the 1860 Census in Pike Co., MS with wife Mary C., son Barney. Again he was shown as a farmer born in Louisiana.

In 1870 he was enumerated with just his wife Mary and he showed a birth in MS.

In 1880 he was enumerated with his new wife Mary S. and their six children. He was 73 and his youngest daughter was just 3. A step-daughter was living with them. He showed his birthplace to be MS in this census also.

From New Orleans Christian Advocate, June 12, 1884, page 2:

Bro. Alford was converted and joined the Methodist Episcopal Church in the 18th year of his age and never afterwards doubted his conversion. For several years he exercised his gifts as an exhorter and about 1857 or 1858 he was licensed to preach. Bro. Alford was a thorough Methodist and zealously advocated the doctrine and [illegible] of the church and was a useful local preacher until age and infirmity rendered him unable to attend to his appointments. He was a holy Christian man and filled his place well in every relationship and responsibility of life. He died as he had lived—with 'faith strong in the Lord,' and with a soul full of love and the Holy Ghost—prepared and ready to 'enter into that rest which remaineth to the people of God.'

John Alford was listed as surety on the marriage record. Stephen Hunter was bondsman and he was appointed guardian of Nancy on same date as marriage. (Louisa County Guardian Bonds, 1767–1814, page 378)

In the 1810 census, John Alford was listed in Lincoln Co., KY (p. 107) as the head of a family consisting of one free white male of 26 and under 45 years of age, two of under 10, one free white female of 26 and under 45, and one of 10 and under 16.

In the 1820 census, John Alford was listed in Lincoln Co., KY (p. 23) as the head of a family consisting of one free white male of 26 and under 45 years of age, two of 10 and under 16, two of under 10, one free white female of 26 and

under 45, one of 10 and under 16, and one of under 10. Of these, 3 were engaged in agriculture, and 1 in manufacturing.

In the 1830 census, John Alford was listed in Lincoln Co., KY (p. 332) as the head of a family consisting one free white male of 40 and under 50 years of age, two of 20 and under 30, one of 15 and under 20, one of 10 and under 15, two of 5 and under 10, three of under 5, one free white female of 40 and under 50, and one of 20 and under 30.

In the 1840 census, John Alford was listed in Lincoln Co., KY (p. 99) as the head of family consisting of one free white male of 50 and under 60 years of age, one of 20 and under 30, two of 15 and under 20, two of 10 and under 15, one free white female of 40 and under 50, one of 20 and under 30, and one of under 5.

In the 1850 census, Nancy Alford was listed in Lincoln Co., KY with George 26, Frances, a female, 18, Madison 21 and Rosabella 6 months. George, who died in Andersonville Prison in the Civil War, and his wife Frances had a daughter named Rosa Bell Alford.

68. **Jacob Alford** born about 1757, VA, married Mar 4 1779 in Louisa Co., VA,² **Nancy Ann Hunter**, born about 1759, VA, the daughter of **Stephen Hunter** and **Mary Statham**. She died Jul 19 1847, Garrard Co., KY.³ Her will was probated in Garrard Co., KY, 14 Oct 1847. Jacob died Jun 3 1803, Garrard Co., KY.⁴ Marriage recorded in Louisa Co., VA, records and in Rev. Wm. Douglas' register and shows that Jacob was from Fluvanna Co., VA. Witnessed by John Hunter and Hansel Alford.

Jesse Robards, 79, of Garrard Co., KY, declared, on 1 June 1841, that he remembered that "...Jacob Alford, his brother, George Robards, William Layne, Stapleton Crutchfield, Thomas Lawrence, and Joseph Lewis on a Saturday evening got into a frolic at a little country tavern in Goochland County in 1777 and all of them enlisted at the same time under Lt. George Holland for three years. They all went into the army except Joseph Lewis who was an indentured apprentice and by that means his father got him off. They joined Capt. Hawkins company of the 14th Virginia Regiment. Capt.Hawkins fell at Brandywine and Jacob Alford was wounded..." in the ankle there. (Virginia Revolutionary Pension Applications, #1, 55).

Jacob Alford married Nancy Hunter in Louisa County near the Goochland County line prior to Robards leaving for KY in 1780. Alford moved to KY a few years afterward and settled near Robards. From Jessamine Bland James, Records of the Andrew Hunter Family of Louisa County, Virginia and Jacob Alford Family of Garrard County, Kentucky and Charles Alford Family of Garrard County, Kentucky, Compiled from Court Records, Bibles and Tombstones (Tucson, AZ: By the author, no date—[apparently this was an unpublished work typed and reproduced in limited copies]), p. 30:

JACOB ALFORD, m. in Louisa Co., Va. Mar. 4, 1779 Nancy Hunter dau. Of Stephen Hunter and Mary Statham of Louisa Co., Va. This marriage record is found in Louisa Co., also in Rev. Wm. Douglas Register in which he states that Jacob Alford was from Fluvanna Co., Va. Rev. Douglas also recorded the birth of the first of four children of Jacob Alford and Nancy Hunter. Jacob Alford died in Garrard Co., Ky. June 3 or 23, 1803 intestate. Nancy, his wife left a will probated in Garrard Co., Ky. Oct. 14, 1847. We do not know when they moved to Garrard Co. Ky. from Va. but possibly between the time of the births of the 4th and 5th children, or between Feb. 25, 1785 and Mar. 10, 1787. Jacob Alford served in the Rev. War and was wounded in the ankle at the battle of Brandywine (See Pension Papers) and Nancy Alford received a pension because of this service of her husband. In her application for this pension she gave much family data, including the names and birth dates of her children by Jacob Alford. Old Ky. Entries and Deeds by Jillson* on p. 313 shows that Jacob Alford was issued 100 acres of land in Ky. Jan. 1, 1784 for "3 years soldier Virginia line" and the Garrard Co., Ky. Deed Bk. Ap. 79 Oct. 27, 1797 John Gray and wife Elizabeth sell 150 acres of land in Garrard Co., Ky. to Jacob Alford.

*Willard Rouse Jillson, Old Kentucky Entries And Deeds; A Complete Index to All of the Earliest Land Entries, Military Warrants, Deeds and Wills of the Commonwealth of Kentucky (Baltimore, MD: Genealogical Publishing Co., Inc., 1972).

Jacob Alford was pensioned by Virginia for £5 per year from 15 March 1779 until 31 Dec 1785. He was also pensioned from 4 Sep 1789 at \$26.66 per annum.

On 12 Jan 1784, Jacob Alford was granted land warrant #2238 for 100 acres for his service of three years in the Virginia Continental line (Virginia Revolutionary Pension Applications, #1, 55 (W.386)).

On 18 Sep 1784, Jacob Alford was paid in full 37£ 15s 8d by the State of Virginia as a soldier of infantry.

On the 1810 census, Nancy Alford was listed in Garrard Co., KY (p. 199) as the head of a family consisting of one free white female of 45 years of age and older, one of 16

and under 26, two free white males of 16 and under 26, and one of 10 and under 16.

On 23 June 1824, Nancy Alford, formerly Nancy Hunter, and Samuel Hunter, of Garrard Co., KY, appointed their brother, George Hunter, of Louisa Co., VA, their lawful attorney to sell lots which fell to them in the division of the lands of which Stephen Hunter late of the County of Louisa died seized and possessed of, as children and legatees of said Stephen Hunter, land on Roundabout Creek (Louisa County VA Deeds, Book O, 326).

On the 1830 census, Nancy Alford was listed in Garrard Co., KY (p. 206) as the head of a family consisting of herself, a free white female of 60 and under 70 years of age.

On 1 May 1839, Nancy Alford, of Garrard Co., KY, was placed on the KY pension roll at \$20 per annum under the Act of 1832. Certificate 6226 was issued on 11 June 1841 (Virginia Revolutionary Pension Applications, I, 55).

On the 1840 census, Nancy Alford was listed in Garrard Co., KY (p. 51) as the head of a family consisting of herself, a free white female of 80 and under 90 years of age.

In her will of 8 Jan 1842, probated in 1847, Nancy Alford mentioned her children, Charles, John, Peyton, Jesse, William, Patsy Jenkins and Polly King (Garrard County Wills, Book L, 427). See "Will of Nancy Hunter Alford, 1842 KY," *AAFA ACTION* Winter 1999, pp. 32–33.

On 29 June 1844, Nancy Alford, aged about 84, made a declaration regarding Jacob Alford's early pensions (Virginia Revolutionary Pension Applications, I, 55).

5th Great-Grandparents

136. **James Alford** born 1715/20, VA, married about 1745 in VA,⁵ **Lucy Bailey**, born 1715/25, VA. Was she one of the Lucy Baileys born in New Kent Co., daughter of Thomas in 1715; or daughter of John and Anna in 1722? James died May 26 1782, Fluvanna Co., VA. Was he the James Alford who birth was registered in St. Peter's Parish in New Kent County in 1713, son of James Alford? It was probably he who bought land September 16, 1740 in Goochland County.

Henry and his older brother William moved from England to Canada in 1876 to work. In nine months William sent for

his wife. They had lost an 8 month old son in England. From Canada they moved first to Iowa and then to Avon, South Dakota. In 1890 they moved to Nebraska where they homesteaded southwest of Monowi.

Henry left Clayton, IA in 1884 and settled north of Springfield, SD, near Avon. In 1892 the moved to Boyd Co., NE.

AAFA has checked the LDS VITAL RECORDS INDEX, BRITISH ISLES and found no Henry Alford listed as born in Devonshire. Checked the LDS 1851 census of Devonshire and found some 90 different Alford families listed. No way to speculate as to which might have been Henry's father Alford.

The rest of the family (other than Robert) were in Preble Co. OH in 1840, and several sons married there.

He is commonly referred to as "Irish John Alford" by AAFA because his son, John Jr., is found on a list of soldiers assembled at Albemarle Courthouse in 1782 and listed as a tailor from Rockingham Co., VA, born 1758 in Monaghan, Ireland.

There was a John Alford with son Benjamin and John Jr., who was evidently over 21 in Rockingham Co., VA in 1788. In 1792, John Alford was listed with sons Robert and Benjamin still living at home. John, Jr. was no longer listed. John Alford, Sr. owned 180 acres of land in 1789 on Mill Creek just north of the town of Cross Keys. The will of this John Alford, dated or probated 25 October 1809 in Rockingham Co., VA, is referred to in several deeds, but the will itself was burned and is no longer available. The deeds help determine some of the members of this family. Census records, tax records and these deeds suggest John's wife was Nancy. In 1774 in Augusta Co., VA John Alford donated shoe buckles, whisky, compasses and buttons to the cause of the American patriots.

I Benedictus Alvard of Windsor do make this my last Will & Testament: After my Just Debts are payd, my wife during her Widowhood shall have the Proffitt, Use & Benefit of my Estate for her Comfortable Livelyhood; but if she marryes, to have £30 of what Estate she shall see Cause to take, to be to her own free Dispose. To my son Jonathan I give 20 shillings besides what formerly I have given him. To Josias Alvard, my 2nd son, £40 and the Farme that was given me by the Country. To my daughter Elizabeth Drake £5 besides what she hath already received; and a Sheep apeice to each of the Children. To my son Jeremy, after the decease of my wife, all my Houseing and Land in Windsor, together with all other my Moveable Estate in Windsor, and all other Estate that is and shall appear to be due unto me on Books, he paying out of it those Legacies as are before expressed. Also my Will is that my son Jeremy shall be Executor. Further, that my loving wife shall live with my son Jeremy, and that he shall have the Improvement and Management of it, allowing his Mother comfortable mayntenance out of it as long as she lives in this World.

He had laid by 250 bushels of Indian corn, 50 bushels of oats, 800 pounds of rice, 3 bales of ginned cotton weighing 400 pounds each, and 100 bushels of sweet potatoes.

Wave a Wand and Recall a Man Who Revered Magic By Frank Ritter

About six months ago, a teen-age friend of mine confided that he was interested in becoming a magician, and asked my advice.

I told him, "First we start with David Price." Then we drove out to Old Hickory Boulevard, just off Hillsboro Road, to David's house and visited in David's home what is perhaps the greatest museum of magic and magicians in the United States, if not the world.

David, 87, confined to a wheel-chair because of injuries to his feet from World War II, was a gracious host. He knew everything there is to about magicians—from Houdini to David Copperfield, who has made several visits to the private museum.

Copperfield once asked if he could buy the museum, which is priceless. Or if he could inherit it when David died. David, such a gentle, soft-spoken man with a great sense of humor, replied with a chuckle, "No, I think it will go to my son, David Jr."

David Jr., of Nashville, now has the museum, because his father died early yesterday morning.... Burial service will be private.

Private funeral services! I guess that's because David Price, a retired auditor for the Internal Revenue Service, was a private person. He didn't go looking for attention. You had to draw him out—but, oh, when you drew him out, the stories he could tell!

Stories about magic, which David fell in love with at age 6 when he came across a preacher who got youngsters into church by doing magic tricks. By the time David was 18, he was appearing before civic clubs and small-town audiences.

David's favorite magician of all time was Alexander Herrmann, who played the Egyptian Hall in London which is why David called his own museum "The Egyptian Hall."

.... David went to war with the U.S. Army in the 1940s and served in both Europe and the Pacific. He walked a lot with a backpack, and when he came out of the war, his feet were in such bad shape that he could never walk again.

He came home to his wife, Virginia, whom he had met on a blind date in Nashville and married June 19, 1934. Virginia is herself quite a character, well-known in Nashville's political circles because she is a self-

David Price had a long association with AAFA. He was inducted into the Alford Hall of Fame in 1995 for his contributions to Alford genealogy and his support of AAFA. We published an article about his life and his contributions to the world of magic in "David Price, Jr., AAFA Hall of Famer," *AAFA ACTION* Summer 1996, pp. 39–40.

Dave's great-grandparents were Artemus Salathiel Alford (Jacob⁵, William⁴, Lodwick³, James², John¹), born 1822 GA, and Susan Amanda Cooper, born 1837 GA. Dave compiled a large amount of data on his family and Alford ancestors that he generously shared with AAFA. We began publishing it in "David Price's Alford Genealogy," *AAFA ACTION* Summer 1997, pp. 53–56, and we hope to continue with that effort as soon as we can enlist someone to type it for publication.

David Price III wrote to Gil Alford on

professed "yellow dog Democrat."

"Yellow-dog Democrat" means that you would vote for a yellow dog before you would consider voting for a Republican. That's how passionate Virginia is about her politics.

David was never that way. His interests were in other things. Magic!

Walking into David's museum is an experience of a lifetime. Look at it: There are magic wands. Magic cards. A pair of handcuffs used by Houdini. Thousands of posters advertising magic shows....

In the museum, there are clippings describing the death of the great magician Lafayette, who burned to death trying to save his horses during a theater fire in Scotland, May 8, 1911. Lafayette was buried with his dog, which had died a week earlier. He loved the dog, which had been given to him by Houdini when both of them were once in Nashville.

You never knew before, did you, that Houdini once visited Nashville? David could have told you that!

blood donor for the American Red Cross and was preceded in death by her husband, Jack Augustus Bray, and a daughter, Jeannie Dell Bray.

Virginia's daughter, Nancy Elkin AAFA #618, wrote this memorial to her mother:

On January 1, 1919 in the Thorn Community of Chickasaw Co., MS, the third child was born to Watty Washington Alford and Elmer Olive Berry Alford. They named her Virginia. There has always been some discrepancy as to her birthdate. When she applied for Social Security, she saw her birth certificate for the first time, with her birthdate listed as December 31, 1918. However, she always celebrated her birthday on New Year's Day.

As a child and young woman, Virginia attended the Thorn Methodist Church. A fond memory that she related was enjoying her mother's singing. She especially liked the first Sunday in August, when there was always an "all-day singing with dinner on the ground."

Even as a child, she rarely missed a family reunion. When she was a little older, she always wanted to be the first one at the reunion and the last one to leave. She attended several of AAFA's annual meetings. Her ancestry can be traced back to Jeptha Alford, the progenitor of the Alford families of Chickasaw County, MS.

My mother often spoke of stories from her childhood. Once she was walking home from a school when a hail storm began. She quickly took off her coat and wrapped her school books in it—those were very important to her. During the Depression, her family lived on a farm and raised their own food, so she said she really never knew they were poor. They would gather food and take it about once a month to relatives who lived in town and were not as fortunate as they were!

She attended Houston High School, quitting school the day before graduation because her parents could not afford a white dress for the ceremony. She later received her high school diploma from Owen County High School in Owenton, KY.

Virginia married Jack Augustus "Gus" Bray on May 30, 1936 in Chickasaw County, MS. They were blessed with two daughters, Jeannie Dell Bray (11/18/1942–7/5/1954) and me, Nancy Cheryl Bray Elkin (b. 8/28/1946). Gus began his lifelong career with the Kraft Cheese Plant in May 1928 in Houston, MS. Shortly after their marriage he was transferred to Columbus, MS, and was with the Kraft Foods Company for 40 years when he retired. The family moved 27 times during their 47 years of marriage.

Virginia was known to her daughter, grandson, and granddaughter as a tender, loving, and caring mother and grandmother. To her siblings, other relatives, and close friends, she was lovingly known as "Mama Gin." She

Prominent resident honored by national family organization

Daniel Lee Alford, Jr. was honored on Sunday, December 1, at the Surrey Inn Restaurant in Caldwell. D.L. is a founding member of the Alford American Family Association (AAFA) and was inducted into the Alford Hall of Fame by that organization at its October 1996 annual meeting in Springfield, Missouri. Although unable to attend the Springfield meeting, D.L. received the framed document at a mini-reunion held in his honor in Caldwell. Twenty-four family members and friends were present. James "Posey" Alford of Gonzales, who attended the meeting in Springfield, presented the award.

D.L. and his wife Catherine have been very active in the AAFA organization. He was on its board of directors and served for several years as vice-president in charge of the Texas chapter, the largest of the state chapters. D.L. played a major role in organizing the second annual meeting of the AAFA, which was held in Houston in 1989. Subsequent meetings have been in North Carolina, Mississippi, Florida, Louisiana, Virginia, Alabama, and Missouri. D.L. and Catherine have attended a majority of the meetings.

Tribute to D.L. Alford, Jr. By Gil Alford, AAFA President

No matter what the award or how well written it is, those such as our Hall of Fame certificates just cannot say all that should be said about a person. We first heard from D.L. (Daniel Lee Alford, Jr.) when he wrote a letter February 18, 1988 in which he expressed an interest in his Alford ancestry and asked about help. One statement was, "I think that I am descended from Lodowick of New Kent County Va. but don't have enough information to verify it." At that time AAFA had about 50 members of which six were from Texas. As AAFA #54. D.L. was the seventh member from Texas.

He was provided a little information and the name and address of Ruby Alford Heard AAFA #137 who had helped me extensively with my old newsletter About Alfords and who later became the AAFA Mississippi State Representative She was probably more knowledgeable on his branch of the family than anyone else. D.L. immediately called Ruby and within a matter of four months he and Catherine had gone to Jackson to visit her, visited the area where his ancestors lived and were buried and then went on to Georgia and visited sites there related to his family.

As D.L. was learning about his family, others of us were planning the first AAFA meeting in Atlanta, GA. D.L. and I talked on the phone often in those days. For reasons I can't remember now, D.L. and Catherine were not able to attend. He had told us that they,

along with some other Texas members, like Landon Alford AAFA #2, would be happy to host a 1989 meeting. Those present in Atlanta agreed to go along with the Texans. With only a little more than a dozen at our meeting in Atlanta we were not at all sure about the future of AAFA and the likely success of more meetings. In my mind I saw the Texas meeting as the critical point for AAFA. The future and success of AAFA depended upon the success and future of the meeting in Texas.

By the time we met in Houston in October 1989 the membership had grown to 250 and much of that growth could be attributed to the promotion of the Texas delegation, primarily D.L. Of the 200 new members, 67—over one quarter-were from Texas and many of them could be traced to D.L. and his family. At that meeting we had over 120 folks present. That was equal to about half the membership. It was almost ten times the attendance at the previous meeting and rarely since then have we had 120 present at a meeting and never have we had nearly half the AAFA membership present at a meeting since Houston..

The Atlanta meeting lasted from 9:00 A.M. till noon with time out for coffee. In Houston we had a reception on Friday evening at the expense of the Texas delegation. It was well received and set the standard for the Friday evening event, now standard at the AAFA meetings. If you review the meeting report published in AAFA ACTION December 1989 you will immediately see the fingerprints of D.L. all over it. In four of the six meetings since the Texas meeting, the Texas delegations present at the meetings have out numbered the host state delegation. In my opinion that is the result of the influence of D.L. and the enthusiasm and dedication he created in Houston. The idea of the AAFA store came out of the meeting from the Alford crochet presented by

Katherine Black AAFA #134 and the tshirts and aprons shown by the late Elizabeth "Liz" Williams AAFA #40 and her cousin the late Julius "Pooley" Alford AAFA #13.

Having such a successful meeting in Texas in 1989 we are returning to Texas in 1999—the first time we have ever repeated a state. As far as I am concerned, the 1999 meeting is dedicated to D.L. Alford, Jr.

Tribute to Lucille Mehrkam By Gil Alford, AAFA President

Hall of Fame proclamations just can't say all that should be said about the person. I believe that were it not for Lucille I would never have done *About Alfords*, which was something of a seed for AAFA. Here's the text of my first letter, August 19, 1982, from Lucille:

I am glad someone has put the Alford family on computer. [In telling folks I had the Alford family on computer I was out of my mind. At that time I thought the Alford family was me and a few dozen other folks.] My son has one and has promised to do so for me but I can't keep him home from fishing long enough. (Hope you can read this as I am having trouble with my eyes and it is affecting my typing.) [Remember that she had eye trouble in 1982].

First I would like to know what you already have as I have some two or three thousand cards on Alford's. First do you have the Alford Family Bulletin by Mrs. Lewis O. Bowman? [Had never heard of it but have it now—that's another story.] Do you have the Alford family from England? [Had never heard of it but have it now.] Do you have Arthur Alford family of Horry

Co. S.C.? [No, but do now—another story.] I have all of the Alford information as found in the Ala. Reg by Granduel & Jones. I have all the births and deaths in Texas from 1903 thru 1960. I have lots of Alford's from Wake and Franklin Co., NC. Nearly all the Alfords of MS and LA. I also have the Alford family as found in the Fulmore Family by Cade Fulmore. I also have lots of information on Cade Alford of NC, AL & MS. I have the marriage (Alford) records of NC by Murray Genealogy from Hunting for Bears Inc. I do have some information on the Alfords of TN.

I am enclosing a copy of my files on Alford's. Any help on my family will be appreciated as this is my problem ancestor.

Included in her letter was a list of names and addresses of all the folks she knew who were interested in Alford. I contacted all of those folks and responded to her letter telling her that I didn't have any of the stuff she mentioned, having never heard of it. On September 7, 1982 I received a very short letter from her: "Mailed my Alford information to you last Fri. You should have it by now. Enclosing some information I do not believe I had put in my Alford book. Just put it in the back." We had indeed received her "Alford Book." It was a huge 3-ring binder, about 3 or 4 inches thick, and it was packed with data. More Alfords than I had ever seen or imagined. The important thing here is that she trusted me completely with this precious data. She had no back-up and she did not press me for any return date promises. By September 11, 1982 I had made copies of the content and returned her book. By this time I was corresponding with a number of folks, many from her list, and had considerable data. To save time doing personal letters to these folks in November 1982 I sent most of them a free 8 page thing called "About Alfords." By demand the number of pages and copies increased such that

by April 1983 when I did *About Alfords* #3 there were 24 pages and a \$10 annual fee. Had Lucille not done what she did I doubt very seriously if *About Alfords* would ever have come about, and I suspect that had we not had *About Alfords*, AAFA would not have been conceived.

But she did not stop there. On Nov 11, 1982 she wrote:

Congratulations on getting the "About Alfords" newsletter off the ground, we will be looking forward to each issue.

Would you mind telling me what kind of Computer you have and what kind of program? My son has promised to buy me one (or build it) for xmas.

I have talked to several about the Apple and the TRS-80 but none of them seem to be happy with the program. My son says he will write me a program if I will tell him what I want but I'm not sure.

Any suggestions will be appreciated.

Now get this. She enclosed \$1.20 in stamps along with five more pages of Alford data.

On April 27 1983 I received a letter from her, obviously done on a dot-matrix printer and printed on green and white lined computer paper:

I have a TRS 80 III with a full 48K memory. I have two drives modified to use NEWDOS/80 V.2, my printer is a matrix, serial, dot Microline 83A.

I am using Scriptsit, Profile and Gensystems at this time. I have not had time to really work with the computer to decide just how I am going to get my genealogical information up at this time. As you know I am a beginner at this.

Keep up the good work on the "About Alfords."

To make what could be a very long story short, she has continued to write notes and send Alford data these last 17 years. There is one notebook in the AAFA collection here with just her letters and notes. Those who have been to the meetings have seen some of our many AAFA notebooks of data. Her information permeates a large percentage of them. If you were at the meeting in Houston or Raleigh then you probably met Lucille.

The most unbelievable thing that she has done is to enter into WordPerfect files, organized by Texas County, everything that she has on Texas Alfords. Material published in *About* Alfords or AAFA ACTION finds its way into these files with the appropriate credit as does all census data. Much of it of course started with her 1982 notebook. This data is printed and filed in the AAFA Texas Counties notebooks-you can see them in San Antonio. Computer file copies of them have been made and sent to several AAFA members who are involved in Texas research.

All of this has been done by this little lady who was suffering with eye problems when it all started, who has endured at least one heart attack, computer failures and who knows what else. If something is published in a Houston paper about an Alford, I expect it here in a matter of days from Lucille. In her spare time, when AAFA had state representatives, she was the AAFA TX State Rep, and for the time we had a Texas Chapter she was the Texas Genealogist. She has never complained and she has never asked for anything. In the beginning she said she hoped to learn something about her Alfords but to this date we have uncovered no new information on them. It is important to see what one person's participation beyond her immediate family has done for our Alford cause.

We love you Lucille.

Margaret Alford Healy, widow of former *Times-Picayune* Executive Editor George W. Healy Jr., died Wednesday at her home. She was 91. Mrs. Healy was born in Issaquena County, Miss., and had lived in New Orleans since 1927.

Mrs. Healy grew up polished and proper, raised on a Southern plantation and graduated from the University of Mississippi, where she was a member of Chi Omega sorority and where she briefly made George Healy Jr.'s acquaintance.

The second time she met him, the circumstances were different: She was in a Vicksburg Hospital, where she had been evacuated from Greenville during the great Mississippi Valley flood of 1927. Healy was working as a reporter, covering the disaster for The Times-Picayune.

The two were married that September at Hopedale Plantation, where she was raised, in the Mississippi Delta.

Healy brought his bride to New Orleans to begin a whirlwind life that the Mississippi native hesitantly embraced but nonetheless mastered, her family said.

When John F. Kennedy was campaigning for president, Mrs. Healy entertained Jacqueline Kennedy with a day of shopping and lunch in New Orleans.

She held a dinner party for Carol Channing, entertained comic Gracie Allen, the wife of comedian George Burns, and played bridge with champion Charles Goren.

She held court at Brennan's restaurant, where plenty of politicians and national luminaries were guided through revelry and dining, New Orleans style.

The Healys were spared what would have been the paramount social challenges of the 1950s when Fidel Castro, invited by Healy to speak at a convention of the American Society of Newspaper Editors, declined their hospitality.

"He was so worried about his safety, he stayed at a hotel and brought live chickens with him to slaughter for his meals," said Mrs. Healy's son, George Healy III. "She didn't have to entertain him."

Though deft at playing host to dignitaries, living a stint in the nation's capital and enduring claustrophobia in the pyramids of Egypt, Mrs. Healy flourished and worked best with her community and family.

She was a member of Christ Church Cathedral and a volunteer at Ochsner Foundation Hospital, where she was among the "gray ladies" who comforted patients.

She worked with the Navy League and the Red Cross and was a block warden during World War II. She was a former member of the PTA of Henry W. Allen School. Survivors include a son, George Healy III; two sisters,

Aurora Alford Gilchrist of Jackson, Miss., and Roberta Alford Kleinschmidt; five grandchildren; and five great-grandchildren. A memorial service will be held Monday at 2 p.m. at Christ Church Cathedral.... Lake Lawn Metairie Funeral Home is in charge of arrangements.



Leslie-Alford-Mims House, Wake Co., NC

The Wake County, NC, local historic landmark that is the subject of this article was once owned by George Benton Alford, the uncle of AAFA's first President, Lodwick Alford, AAFA #11. George Benton was born and died in Holly Springs, a town he helped redevelop after its devastation following the Civil War. He was the first of the seven children of Green Haywood Alford and Rebecca Jones. "George Benton Alford, 1845-1924," was published in AAFA ACTION December 1990, pp. 32-33, 54. It included two short biographies of George, one published in the early 1900s and one shortly after his death on 5 April 1924. We also published a biography of his father, "Biography: Green Haywood Alford," AAFA ACTION, March 1989, pp. 22-23.

Note from Lodwick Alford: George Benton Alford was generally called Benton. His brothers and sisters always spoke of him as "Bent," while friends spoke of him as "G. Bent."

Historic House Declared Landmark

The handsome Leslie-Alford-Mims house which stands at the heart of Holly Springs and has figured into much of the town's history, has been designated a historic landmark in Wake County.

Final action granting landmark status to the 26-room Greek Revival styled mansion, built about 1840, came Tuesday night when the Holly Springs town board approved a request from the Wake County Historic Preservation Commission to designate the house a local historic landmark.

Dan Turner of Fuquay-Varina, who describes himself as the unofficial historian of southern Wake County, was commissioned by Edwin Mims, present owner of the property, to request the historic site classification. Turner has also submitted an application and documentation to have the Leslie-Alford-Mims house placed on the National Register of Historic Places. He said the state's review committee will decide in January whether to refer the application to the U.S. Department of the Interior for a final decision.

The Leslie-Alford-Mims house stands on a 13.33-acre tract of land which includes the five natural springs and holly trees from which the town took its name.

While the sprawling, white mansion is well-known to longtime Holly Springs residents and even to many newcomers who could hardly miss so stately a mansion so centrally located, few residents, old or new, have ever been inside the house.

Mims, 78, a silver-haired man with a courtly manner, lives a quiet life in the big house. He has never married.

For many years he ran a store, first a drug store and later an antique shop, about a block from his home. These days he helps out at Larry Dewar's florist and antique store on Main Street.

Mims is grandson of the second owner of the big white house, George Benton Alford and his second wife, Texanna Alford. He remembers his family moving into the big house to live with his grandmother when he was eight or nine years old.

Mims left Holly Springs to attend colleges, first in New York City, then in California. His interests were in liberal arts, English and music. He subsequently lived in Florida before returning to his home town and the big house where his mother still lived around 1950.

Throughout its history the Holly Springs community has experienced periods of prosperity followed by periods of decline. Always the Leslie-Alford-Mims house has figured prominently in the times good or bad.

The house was built around 1840 by Archibald Leslie of Scottish descent, described by Turner as "a prominent Holly Springs businessman and tailor."

At that time the community of Holly Springs stood at the crossroads of Fish Dam and Avent Ferry roads.

Leslie married Isabelle Rogers, the daughter of a prominent local family, built a house and a store and established a tailoring business at the crossroads.

According to Turner's history, a bustling village which came to be known as Holly Springs grew up around the store. Leslie also served as postmaster from 1849 till 1859.

"As a successful business man and as one of the leading citizens of the area, Leslie built a substantial house which would reflect his status in the community," Turner writes.

Turner continues:

"By 1860 the village of Holly Springs consisted of five stores, a large church and a Masonic lodge, all surrounded by a community of prosperous farmers; the Civil War ended this period of prosperity. In April 1865, Sherman's

army reached Holly Springs and created havoc in the village, roaming the countryside in foraging parties.

"Col. W.J. Palmer of the Union Army appropriated the Leslie home for about two weeks as headquarters of the Fourteenth Army Corps.

"As with the rest of North Carolina, Holly Springs was devastated by the war and

drawing business and residents away from Holly Springs. By 1871 Holly Springs was described as a "deserted village."

Then came the colorful and wealthy George Benton Alford who moved his mercantile business from Middle Creek Township to Holly Springs and was instrumental in beginning an economic revival in the town.

Turner writes of Alford
that he was a civic
minded individual,
serving at various
times as a justice of the
peace and county
commissioner. A
progressive businessman with a dream of
making Holly Springs into an industrial city, he is credited with being
largely responsible for the village
becoming something of a boom town

at the turn of the century.

Alford bought the imposing Leslie house and enlarged it, more than doubling the floor space, in 1876. He enlarged a second time in 1900.

He loved to entertain, Turner's research has indicated. So in remodeling his home he included a ballroom with a small gallery for an orchestra.

"If there is another house of the period in Wake County that has a ballroom, I don't know about it," said Turner.

The oversized porte cochere was planned to accommodate four carriages arriving at once for the fancy balls the Alfords held.

According to Turner, Alford "had his hand in every pie around." Among his

numerous business interests were a general mercantile store, a sawmill, a cotton gin and the Holly Springs Land and Improvement Company which, among other things, was to

build and operate cotton mills.

In 1899 he founded the Cape Fear and Advertising Company which published

the Cape Fear Enterprise, which Turner writes was "the voice of Alford's singleminded attempt to build up the town."

In 1898 he and 20 other prominent men in the community received a charter of incorporation from the General Assembly for the Cape Fear and Northern Railroad. Alford was its first president.

Alford also sought to capitalize on the area's natural beauty and

resources by developing the springs into a resort. The large 1900's addition to his home was designed as guest

quarters to accommodate visitors to the springs.

Alford was a Confederate veteran, having served as a private in Company I, 41st Regiment North Carolina State Troops (3rd Regiment, North Carolina Cavalry). It was his leadership of the local United Confederate Veterans troop and his devotion to keeping alive the achievements and sacrifices of the 41st regiment that Alford earned his honorary title of colonel. And it was Alford who erected the handsome monument to the Wake County Confederate veterans in front of his house. [The monument was unveiled on 25 Oct 1923, less than six months before his death.]

Alford died in 1924 and was buried in the family cemetery by the springs. The house continued to be occupied by his widow Texanna Alford, until her death in 1938. The house then was inherited by her daughter, Delcie, who lived there for many years with her husband Marcus E. Mims. It was after Mims' death that Edwin Mims returned to Holly Springs to live in the big house with his mother.

Their son, Ed Mims, has preserved the house in its 1900's condition. About the only change, according to Turner, was the addition of bathrooms in the 1950's.

Turner said true value is added to the house as a historic site because almost no changes have been made in its basic structure and design through the years.

He said the original house and the 1876 addition as well as the 1990 addition are each faithfully representative of the periods in which they were constructed.

All of the historical research on the Mims house was done by volunteers.

Turner expressed appreciation to staff members of the North Carolina Division of Archives for technical assistance: Steven Massengill, head of the non-textural materials unit and James Sorrell, registrar, who is an Alford family descendant.

Past Visible in Holly Springs

Holly Springs—Hang a right off N.C. 55, the main drag through the once sleepy southern town of Holly Springs, and there at 100 Avent Ferry Road is a sight out of time.

The Leslie-Alford-Mims House, a Greek Revival style house named for the succession of families who have owned it since it was built about 1840, crowns a low hill. In a town where new housing developments are popping up like spring dandelions, the house is a tangible piece of town history.

On its grounds are the five natural springs for which the town was named. A war memorial monument with familiar local names graces one side of the front yard. A slightly sagging porte-cochere—like a carport for horses and carriages in a bygone era—stretches out to the side. Now draped with rambling wisteria, it recalls days when the house was a center of social and political life.

"I want to see it preserved," said Hubert Edwin "Ed" Mims, 78, the current owner and only resident of the sprawling 32-room house.

To that end the Leslie-Alford-Mims house recently was listed as a Holly Springs Local Landmark Property by the Holly Springs Town Board, on the recommendation of the Wake County Historic Preservation Commission. That, in itself, made a little history. The house is the first local landmark property designated in Holly Springs.

And a listing on the National Register of Historic Places, an honor conveyed by the National Park Service, is in the works and should be announced within a few months, said Robin Quinn, Wake County preservation planner.

The historic designations won't guarantee that the house won't ever be razed, but they will make people more aware of the house's historic status.

If demolition is threatened, the commission requires a 365-day delay, to give owners and preservationists time to look for buyers or find an acceptable alternative.

Also, the local landmark designation will require the owner to have exterior changes reviewed by the commission or its preservation planners.

That satisfies Mims, who said the house will be inherited by his nephew. And it pleases Dan Turner, the architectural consultant who researched the history and prepared the documents needed for the designations.

"The county is changing so much," Turner said. "So much of our heritage is being erased before our eyes."

Turner said getting the historical designations for the house is an important step for Holly Springs.

"There are a lot of new residents, as well as long-time residents, that are interested in preserving the heritage of the town, "Turner said.

For Mims, now a semi-retired storekeeper, there has been little change. He keeps the interior of the house the way it was when his mother died nearly 30 years ago. Being the private individual that he is, he doesn't invite strangers in to look around.

Outside, the house has undergone changes since the first section was built about 1840 by Archibald Leslie, a Holly Springs businessman and tailor. Leslie married the daughter of a local family, built a country store, and established his tailoring business there at the crossroads of Fish Dam and Avent Ferry Roads, near the group of five natural springs. He built the house for his bride, and the town grew up around the store.

The three-story house has columns supporting first- and second-story porches and a widow's walk on top. The first floor includes a ballroom with a small alcove for musicians. The house was reportedly the scene of many grand parties. The community was devastated by the Civil War and Reconstruction, and a railroad went through neighboring Apex, drawing activity away from Holly Springs. After Sherman's soldiers came through in 1865, the Leslie home briefly was taken over as an Army headquarters, Turner learned in his research.

In 1875, George Benton Alford moved a mercantile business to Holly Springs and started an economic upsurge. He bought the house and added an east wing and a kitchen. About 1900, he added the West wing and portecochere, to accommodate visitors to the springs.

Alford, who helped get Holly Springs incorporated in 1877, was an entrepreneur, running a store, a sawmill, a cotton gin, and a land improvement company. He founded a company that published a newspaper, and he helped form a railroad that later became the Durham and Southern.

A Confederate veteran, he led a local veterans group and erected the war monument in front of the house in 1923.

When he died in 1924, Alford was buried in the tiny family cemetery by the springs. His widow lived in the house until she died and her daughter, Delcie Mims inherited it. Delcie Mims or members of her family have resided there since.

The Rest of the Story

The newspaper articles about the old Leslie-Alford-Mims House are very interesting for what they do not tell. First there is controversy about when the house was first built. The clipping says it was built about 1840. But I have a brochure prepared by the official Wake County American Revolution Bicentennial Commission which says it was first built about 1817.

George Benton Alford, the owner of the house for many years, was my oldest uncle and at the time of his death in 1924 he had two grown children. But he did not have a will! My understanding is that NC law at that time was very clear that the widow of a man who died intestate got all his property and his children got nothing. The widow was his second wife, Mrs. Texanna O. Collins, who had four children by her first husband. His two children by his first wife, Charlotte Ann Olive who died in 1897, got absolutely nothing.

Following his death in 1924, his children sued for a portion of his property. There followed a bitter court battle, but in the end a jury had to follow the law and his children came away empty. It was a sensational case in Wake County with great interest and newspaper headlines.

In 1960 the last of Uncle Benton's children died, Green Haywood Alford

II, who left me the walking stick handed down from my great, great grandfather James Lodwick Alford. [See "Wakefield's Walking Cane," *AAFA ACTION* September 88, p. 13.] Haywood's older sister Mattie had died in 1955 and is buried there in Holly Springs. Neither one had any heirs.

It is not clear how just one of Texanna's children, Delcie Collins Mims, got possession of the property. In 1977 when I first started to visit NC for family research, with a brother and a sister we visited Ed Mims in Holly Springs. Needless to say, the Mims and Alfords had not been friendly over the years, and Ed was wary of us. But over the years I gradually won his confidence and the last time I went up to NC he even showed me inside the old house. It was interesting because my father had visited there many times after he came to Georgia in 1885.

If the children of Uncle Benton had inherited the house and neither of them left any heirs, perhaps I would have gotten possession of the old house as I did the walking cane. Alas, it was not to be. Thus did this old historical house pass out of the hands of the Alford family. PITY!

Update, June 1999: The house is now on the National Register of historic houses as well as the state and county list of historic places. It is projected to be restored to its original state with work to begin in the near future. Edwin Mims is still living and has not yet deeded the house over to his nephew but that is expected shortly. ❖

Nevertheless, every attempt has been made to provide a complete and faithful representation of the information recorded on the original enumeration forms.

The categories on each line appear in the following order: name, sex, age in years unless stated as months, color (assumed to be white unless shown otherwise), birth place, *MSR, occupation, and property. Birthplace is shown with the approved postal abbreviations for states in the U.S. Foreign places, if applicable, were abbreviated as follows: AU = Austria, CD = Canada, EN = England, GE = Germany, IR = Ireland, etc.

* There may be any one of three entries:

M = married within the year

S = attended school within the year

R = can't read or write (or just W if can read but not write)

The order of the information in the two-line family header is, on the first line, the name of the political subdivision or enumeration district and the enumeration date; on the second line is the census page number, census dwelling or house number, and census family number (if provided).

Orlando moved from TN to Dallas Co., MO in 1859 driving through with six ox teams. He and Owen Holomon came together and settled about eight miles northeast of Buffalo.

3rd Great-Grandparents

48. **John Alford** born about 1786, NC or maybe TN, married Jan 13 1811 in Grainger Co., TN, **Jane McElhattan**, born about 1791, NC, the daughter of **John McElhattan** and **Elizabeth** _____. Jane died after 1860, Carroll Co., AR. John died 1860/70, Carroll Co., AR.

A Grainger Co., TN, record states that in November 1804 he was age 18, an orphan. He was bound to Thomas Mann to learn art, trade and master of a millwright.⁴

Family "legend" says that about 1852 he moved to Arkansas, and he appears there in 1860 Carroll County living with son (proved by 1850 Roane Co. TN census) Thomas H. Alford and Thomas's family. Supposedly when Thomas enlisted in the CSA, they went back to TN, but no further record of them has been found.

he following are a list of Alfords found in the index to the Tennessee Death Records. These records were found on microfilm in the Birmingham Public Library. Except for the first roll, 1908–1912, all the rolls are individual by year. The roll for 1913 was missing. The last roll available was 1945. Some of the tapes listed the names alphabetically; others were arranged by soundex number. Some of the pages were dark and hard to read—guesses are indicated by brackets []. The year 1940 was especially difficult to read.

Information listed is last name, first name, county of death, and date. Some name variations are included (Alfred, Allford), but because of time limitations, the primary surname searched was Alford. Every effort was made to make a faithful transcription of the original, which should explain unusual spellings of names like "Napolean." Copies of Tennessee Death Certificates can be ordered by writing:

Ask for the form "Application for Certified Copy of Certificate of Death" (form number PH 191663). After you get the form back, fill it out as completely as possible and include a check or money order for \$5.00. It takes about three to six weeks to get the certificate. Usually, the certificate contains the birthdate, parents' names, spouse (if living), and location of burial. The earliest years may not contain as much information.

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John Posey Alford of TX, 1854-1911

y grandfather, John Posey Alford, was born in Washington County, TX, in 1854. Following the death of his parents during or immediately following the Civil War, John, his brother George and two sisters, Mary Jane and Caroline, went to Gonzales County to live with their uncle Winfield Alford, who had been given a land grant by Green DeWitt and was among the early settlers there. Winfield was granted guardianship of John Posey Alford and his brother and sisters.

John married Mary Ann Elizabeth Jane Borrer in 1878. For the rest of their lives, he and and his wife, who was called Jane, lived on a farm just east of Thompsonville in the northern part of the county, where they were highly esteemed participants of their church and community.

had a friendly, outgoing personality and made lifelong friends with each move they made. She was a marvelous homemaker and loved to make things by hand. She made so many quilts and afghans during her life that no one knows what they numbered.

She was a member of Wesley United Methodist Church, a lifetime blood donor for the American Red Cross, and a volunteer at Southwest Florida Regional Medical Center.

On February 24, 1998, my mother passed quietly away in my home in Ft. Myers, FL, of ovarian cancer. She was 79. She is also survived by her grandson, W. Michael Elkin of Indianapolis, IN, and her granddaughter, Tracie L. Angelastri of Gainesville, VA. There are three great-grandsons: Clayton Murphy Elkin, Charles Augustus Elkin, and Colten Michael Elkin, all of Indianapolis. Two brothers, Curtis Etoy Alford of Houston, MS, and J.W. Alford of Portersville, CA, and one sister, Margaret Geraldine Allen of Houston, MS, also survive. She was preceded in death by her daughter Jeannie Dell, her parents Watt and Ollie Alford, and two sisters, Georgia Olline Alford Lawson (8/25/1927–8/21/ 1987) and Mary Ethel Alford Wimberley (11/21/1911–11/18/1995).

Egbert Benson Alford, 1859 AL-1933 TX

A number of AAFA members are descendants of the subject of this article, including Landon Alford, the second person to join the Alford American Family Association, sister Ella Alford AAFA #246, his brother John Alford AAFA #200, and his cousins Mariwynn Watson AAFA #127 and Bess Rayford AAFA #131. This Alford family has lived in Texas since the 1870s, and its members have had prominent political and economic roles in Rusk County.

gbert B. Alford—As a business man and citizen Mr. Alford is easily foremost in the town of Henderson, where he is president of the Mayfield-Alford Company, the largest mercantile house in the town, and is mayor of the civil corporation. Mr. Alford has been a resident of Texas since 1874, and in forty years has progressed from the status of a clerk to a controlling influence in the affairs of a large and prosperous community.

Mr. Alford came to Texas from Chambers county, Alabama, where he was born at Lafayette on April 14, 1859. His family record is one of interest. His father, John Rogers Alford, was a positive force in the social, political and business life of Chambers county, which he served as an official and which he represented in the state legislature. He was born at Walton, Georgia, in 1810, had only a fair amount of education, and succeeded largely by sheer force of his ability and industry. The grandfather was Kinchen B. Alford, a slave holder who lived and died in Georgia, leaving four children. James W., the first of these children died in Georgia; Mary

married Dr. Beall; Feraby married Dr. Hudson and John R. John R. Alford began life as a grocery clerk at Walton, Georgia. In 1836 he moved to Alabama, soon after his marriage and in that state his time was largely taken up with public affairs. He was a government commissioner in the removal of the Indians from his section of Alabama to Florida. His early political support was given to the Whig party, but after the war he was a loyal Democrat. His advanced age put him in the home guard near the close of the war, and he was stationed a short while at West Point, Georgia. In religion he was a Baptist. All his farming operations were carried on with slave labor, and he thus suffered great financial misfortune when the negroes were freed. John R. Alford married Amelia Beall, a daughter of Thaddeus Beall, who went to Alabama from Georgia, about the same time as his son-in-law did. Mrs. Alford died in Henderson, Texas in 1894, and her children are briefly named as follows: Josephine married Major Terrell, and died in Rusk county; Lenora married Charles Taliaferro and lives in Talapoosa, Georgia; Augustus O. lives at Overton, Texas; Achsa married Richard Taliaferro of Georgia; Emma married Burton Dabb, and died at Rome, Georgia; Eliza married George Gammell, and lives in Lafayette, Alabama; John R. died at Overton, Texas in 1882; James lives at Overton; Kinchen B. has his home at Houston, Texas; Egbert B. lives at Henderson, Tex.; and George W. is a resident of Rome, Georgia.

Egbert B. Alford arrived in Texas in December, 1874. He was then about sixteen years of age. His first experience here was as a clerk in a store at Overton. Soon afterwards he moved to Henderson, and while not busy with the work of earning a living attended public schools, and thus finished his education. For two years he was a

clerk in Henderson, and then accepted a place with the wholesale dry goods house of Yale & Bolling at New Orleans, as a traveling salesman. After a few months he went into a similar capacity for the Rice-Stix Dry Goods Company of St. Louis, covering the territory of northeast and east Texas from 1881 for a year or so. On leaving that firm he went to Galveston to become credit man for P.J. Willis & Brother, over their east Texas territory. In 1884, having the experience and the enterprise necessary to start on his own account, Mr. Alford established himself in business at Overton, associated with his brother Kinchen B. Their operations continued there with considerable success until 1891. Since then Mr. Alford has operated with his headquarters and home at Henderson. In this place he bought up several stocks of goods from E. Barthold and from James Claiborne, and succeeded to the business of formerly carried on by the Alliance Store. These consolidated enterprises were conducted by him under his own name until 1904 when he formed a partnership with J.R. Irion. The firm of Alford & Irion prospered for one year, when John B. Mayfield bought an interest and a stock company was then formed, conducted since under the name of the Mayfield-Alford Company. Mr Alford is president of this organization, his son J.R. is secretary, and his daughter Bessie L. is treasurer. The members of his own family have acquired all of the stock, the business being incorporated with a capital of forty thousand dollars.

Besides this successful record as a merchant, Mr. Alford is president of the Guaranty Fund State Bank and Trust Company of Henderson, and is president of the Overton Compress Company. He was for many years engaged in the manufacture of lumber in Rusk county. He organized the Henderson Light & Planing Mill

Company, and did more than any other individual to promote the building of a light plant and the operation of a planing mill here. For many years Mr. Alford has owned Rusk County Land, and has added many acres to the cultivated domain. His theme has been the adoption of "book methods" in farming. Scientific and intensive agriculture have been urged by him upon his tenants and his customers with apparently good results, through his individual efforts, and by impromptu talks to small groups in his place of business. His personal observation where scientific methods have been pursued has made an enthusiastic convert to the idea of intensive farming, and some of his own acres have responded under the touch of that magic wand. His own farm supports a score of families who add yearly to the wealth of Rusk County.

When Henderson resumed its corporate existence in 1912, Mr. Alford was elected mayor. He has aided in the maintenance and improvement of educational matters here for many years as a trustee of the public schools. In many other ways he has identified himself with local civic and political affairs, has acted as chairman of important local meetings and conventions, and is a man who never neglects his civic responsibilities. In 1892, he was a Hogg delegate to the historic Houston convention as a partisan of Texas's famous reform governor. Mr Alford is affiliated with the Masonic Lodge and the Knights of Pythias Order, and his church is the Methodist.

In November, 1880, Mr. Alford was united in marriage with Miss Alice Neal. Her father was Dr. Neal. Mrs Alford died in 1881, without surviving children. In December, 1884, Mr. Alford married Miss Ella Overton. Her father was Dr. Jess Overton, and the family name has a memorial in the present Texas village of that designation. The Overtons came from Tennessee, where the name is likewise preserved in geographic nomenclature,

and Dr. Overton was born in that state and came to Texas before the war. The children of Mr. and Mrs. Alford are: John R., Josie B., wife of J.J. Rayford of Henderson; Bessie L., a student in the Denton State Normal; Jessie B.; E.B. Jr. and Richard Overton. Mr. Alford stands six feet one inch high, weighs about two hundred and twenty pounds, and the force of his character and his business energy are in close harmony with his physical vigor.

Louis Charles Alford of LA, 1862-1939

The author of this sketch, Robert Alford, died on 18 April 1998. He is buried in Progress Cemetery, Sabine Parish, LA.

ouis Charles Alford was my grandfather. In his later years he lost one of his eyes from an unfortunate incident, which I will tell about later on. Louis was William "Henry" Harrison Alford's first son. Records have his birth in the year 1862, and he was the grandson of Edward Barksdale Alford, who dates back to Jake Alford of Washington Parish, LA.

My father was Robert Dewit Alford, who was born on July 15, 1891. I have learned from research that Louis's father was involved in the War Between the States. When he lost his sight, along about the time my grandfather was born, evidently William was back home in Desoto, LA. When the battle of Desoto took its terrible toll. Desoto was relocated on the East border of Sabine Parish, LA. People, along about mid-thirties renamed the town Pleasant Hill, but I remember the old village limit sign said New Desoto until about 1939. However one of my childhood questions was why the sign didn't say Pleasant Hill, because I had always heard it called Pleasant Hill.

I go back there quite often. I guess I am drawn like a magnet—it is beautiful, quiet, and wonderful. Where cotton fields once were there is beautiful forest, the people are in no hurry, and if you are lucky enough to meet one of them, are warm and kind. The two lane blacktop highways winding through the hill's are almost unoccupied.

I can envision how it was in Louis Alford's young life, having listened to stories my grandfather told on rare moods, of how he drove light up teams of mule and oxen on freight wagons through Louisiana, Mississippi, and Texas. He would puff his pipe and say how he and uncle Steve Litton would fare on long trips. He told of hardships such as run ins with cowboys who would ask to spend the night in their wagon circle for safety reasons. He said the cow punchers were hard men, and they all toted pistols. I'd say, "Grandpa, weren't you scared?" He'd look at me and say, "Hell yes, but them fellers didn't know it."

And from what my father has told me about Grandpa Louis, I have my doubts that he was scared. Daddy said when he was four years old, something happened that he never will forget. Back in those days, people would share meat when they butchered. So they could have fresh meat more often, they took turns and helped each other, dividing the meat up among themselves.

It was on such an event that Grandpa Louis set out through Sammy Gill [probably San Miguel] Creek bottom to a neighbor's butchering five miles away. He went on foot, carrying his share of the meat home in a burlap bag in the dark, when he heard a scream that he thought was someone in distress. So he yelled back, but the scream came again, only this time Grandpa heard a growl at the end of the scream. He groped around in the dark and found a big pine knot that had seasoned into lighter pitchwood. He beat that into a pulp on a tree, so he was able to set it on fire. No sooner had he done this than a big panther cat was on the scene. No doubt the cat wanted the meat, but so did Grandpa.

Grandpa told how that cat would defy the fright he had for that fiery torch. He would stand on his rear legs and scream and slap at the torch. This ordeal lasted so long the torch was trying to go out. When Grandpa was holding it upright, the rosin would flow down on his hand. Then when it would try to flicker out, he would tip it down to cause the flame to climb back to a brighter light. Of course the rosin on Grandpa's fist caught on fire too. My father said he heard the commotion going on. As Grandpa arrived six or seven hound dogs were after the cat. When Grandpa came into the yard through the gate, that cat jumped the fence and was tearing dogs up like they were paper. Well having reached the front porch Grandpa threw what was left of the torch at the cat—and a lot of his skin went with the torch.

He came into the house—my father had crawled under the bed. Grandpa took down his old muzzle-loaded gun from over the fireplace and ran back on the porch. The cat had decided to retreat by then, but Grandpa shot as the cat cleared the fence. He doctored his hounds as best he could and retired for the night. The next day some men in a wagon stopped by for a cup of coffee. Grandpa told them what happened the night before. They wanted to know if he had hit the cat when he shot. Grandpa said he didn't know. Upon close inspection the men found blood on the road and later found the cat dead. One of the men said it was a panther from Mexico, said he had seen one before, "probably a jaguar."

I'll tell how Grandpa lost his eye. He was nailing split board shingles on a roof on a cold January morn when a glance-off nail hit him in the right eye. He climbed down off the roof, with the nail plus his eyeball in his hand. Grandpa's sister-in-law, Aunt Sue Bridwell, took a pair of scissors and

cut the cords that were still fastened to the eye. I never knew or even gave much thought as to how being oneeyed can hinder one's activities, not until two years ago when I lost the use of my right eye.

AAFA NOTES: When we first heard of Robert's grandfather's father, William H. Alford, he was mentioned in Hugh Edwin Alford's In Search of My Alford Ancestors as a son of Edwin B. Alford, born August 3, 1823 and "migrated to Texas, no further record." When we later saw the 1850 Texas census and saw, in Matagorda County, William H. Alford age 25 born in Mississippi a Waggoner, we figured this had to be him. It wasn't until 1993 when we heard from Diane, AAFA #632, and she listed Henry Alford born in the 1820s as her 2nd great grandfather that we began to make the connection. He apparently knew he had cousins, aunts and uncles in Sabine Parish, and it was no accident that he settled there.

In the manuscript of this article, Robert spelled his grandfather's name Lewis, but Diane reports that it was spelled Louis. Some additional spelling corrections and other minor editing were also done.

DAYTON [Liberty Co., TX]—Local Confederate veterans groups will honor three soldiers of the War Between the States in an 8:30 a.m. prayer service, Sunday, Nov. 15 in Linney Cemetery. The ceremony will follow the Episcopal prayer book used in the war period.

Commander James B. Sterling III of Company F, Spraight's Battalion Camp No. 858, Sons of Confederated Veterans, said the prayer service will formally dedicate Confederate grave markers for Sgt. Julius Caesar Alford and Privates William Jefferson Holstein and Drewery W. Jackson. The Thomas Jefferson Chambers Chapter, United Daughters of the Confederacy, will help conduct the service.

Julius Caesar Alford

Alford was born in 1847 at Crystal Springs, Mississippi, and enlisted at Jefferson, Texas in 1861. He joined Company A, First Texas infantry regiment, which was later reorganized as the Second Infantry Regiment. He was later promoted to a corporal and then a sergeant. Alford appears on a list of prisoners of war surrendered at Appomattox Court House, Virginia with General Robert E. Lee. He died and his wife Maud later moved to Dayton, May 15, 1936. He is the ancestor of former Dayton Mayor W.M. "Bill" Moreau....

AAFA NOTES: A plaque in the Linney Cemetery says: "Founded in the 1850s, this graveyard was established to serve the citizens of West Liberty (now Dayton). Although there was no early organization of the Cemetery, sections of the burial ground were known by the names of the families interred there, such as Smith and Alford...." In addition to the photos here, Renee contributed photos to the AAFA Photo Archive of the plaque, J.C.'s daughter Lena Alford's gravestone, the gate to Linney Cemetery, and a wider shot of J.C.'s grave showing flags and ribbons from the ceremony.

- 2. Nominations may be made for AAFA work during the last year which contributed significantly towards the purposes and goals of AAFA. The work may but does not have to be outstanding or even excellent. But it has to be significant.

Include a two or three line reason for the nomination.

- 3. Hall of Famers are not eligible for nomination.
