Critical Need: Cemetery Project Officer

Would you like to provide an essential service to Alford researchers? Alicia Houston, AAFA Genealogist, is <u>urgently</u> looking for a Cemetery Records Project Officer for the Association. She is already the Census Project Officer in addition to being the Genealogist, so she can't do too!

We have a number of xeroxed pages of cemetery records from books, many typed cemetery records that have been transcribed from books, and scattered reports from people who have actually been to the cemetery and copied the Alford gravestones. We also have photographs of gravestones. Some of these records have been typed and printed in AAFA ACTION, but we need more than typing.

 A collection procedure (similar to Alicia's system for the Census Project) needs to be set up so members know what cemeteries need to be searched, what information to submit, and where to send it.

- The records we currently have need to be gathered from the various officers who have them and organized, probably by state and county.
- Those that have not been printed in AAFA ACTION should be typed (on a computer) for publication. This needs to be done in a simple but specific format—like that in the preceding article. The Project Officer doesn't need to do the typing him/ herself—just get it coordinated with someone who has a computer.
- Proper source documentation needs to be obtained for many of the records—<u>many</u> don't even have the full name of the book from which they were obtained! Again, this just needs to be coordinated and tracked.
- Photographs/negatives of gravestones need to be collected and filed.
- People willing to search microfilmed cemetery records (how-to info available from AAFA) need to be

identified and organized so the massive amount of informatio out there can be collected.

Cemetery information can be organized and printed in a manner similar to the Booklist. New information can be published in each issue of AAFA ACTION, and a master list can be maintained and made available upon request. Pam Thompson, Publications Director, is willing to maintain this list since she has to format the data for printing anyway.

In addition, all of the gravestone data should be kept on a database so alphabetical lists can be printed and searches done. Gil Alford already has much of this data in his database and will coordinate with the Cemetery Project Officer.
