


1999 Meeting in San Antonio, TX

Saba Co., TX, married (1) Aug 19 1880, in Lampasas, Co., TX, 16. **Joseph W. "Coonie" Hamrick** born Nov 28 1860, San Saba, San Saba Co., TX; married (2) **Dick Graham**, Eliza died in Douglas, Cochise Co., AZ. Joseph died Nov 3 1885, San Saba, San Saba Co., TX.

Eliza Jane Alford was married to Dick Graham AFTER the death of "Coonie" Hamrick.

3rd Great Grandparents

34. **James Gray Alford** born Abt 1822, NC, married Nov 30 1840, in Lauderdale Co., MS, **Harriett Eliza Barnett**, born Abt 1825, AL.

Census 1850, Lauderdale Co., MS, page 348, house 324, family 333: James G. 28 NC, Harriet E. 24 AL, Roena 8 MS, John 6 MS, and Ellen 2 MS.

Census 1860, De Witt Co., TX, page 483, house 421, family 421: J.A. 37 NC, Eliza 34 AL, John 16 MS, Ellin 12 MS, Joseph 6 TX, Mary 4 TX, Georgiana 2 TX and Alice 6 months TX.

Census 1870, not found to date.

Census 1880, June 12, San Saba Co., TX, page 398, house 133, family 135: Jas 58 NC, Eliza 17 TX, Jas. 16 TX. They were also enumerated June 14 1880, same county, page 412, house 92, family 93: James G. 58 NC, Eliza 18 TX and G. James 16 TX.

4th Great Grandparents

68. **Jacob Alford** born Abt 1781, NC, married **Milberry "Milbre" Gray**, (also in some records as "Melva Gray") born Abt 1779, NC. Jacob died Aft 1830, AL or MS.

Census 1850, Lauderdale Co. MS: Milberry and son Sherrod H. were enumerated together.

Census 1860, Lauderdale Co. MS: Milberry and L.H. [probably should be S.H.] Alford were enumerated together in what apparently was a boarding house.

5th Great Grandparents

136. **John Alford** (Julius^{717VA}³, James^{687VA}², John^{645VA}¹) born Est 1747, NC, married **Chloe Pope**. John died After 1830, Greene Co., AL.
