2. (1). PEACHMAN ALFORD was born ca 1795 in VA. He is listed in the 1820 Liberty (now Marion) Co., SC Census with wife and three children. Also listed in the 1820 "List of Insolvent Debtors of Marion Dist., SC". He was a purchaser in the Estate of John Henry, dec'd, in 1821 in Marion Co., SC¹.

m1 ca 1816/17 in NC to a daughter of Henry H. Nelson (no proof), b. ca 1795; she must have died between 1830 & 1836? Peachman is listed in the 1830 Orangeburg Co., St. Matthew Parish, SC census with wife and eight children. The will of Henry H. Nelson dated 1838 in Abbeviller Co., SC lists Peachman Alford, Enoch Nelson, William Nelson and Henry Harvey Nelson, minor². Peachman is found in the 1840 Abbeviller Co., SC census.

m2 on Dec. 1837 in Lowndes Co., AL to Eliz. (Crenshaw) Whipple, b. 1804-09 SC; d. 24 Dec. 1861 Mobile Co., AL; d/o Stephen Crenshaw, b. SC. D. 1827 Lowndes Co., AL; widow of Welcome Whipple; d. 24 Nov. 1836 Lowndes Co., AL; buried at Halyneville's first burial ground.³

Children: Dr. Henry L.; James O.; Jesse; Emily C. m 12 Jan 1845 to Abner, Arch, Jarrett and Susan L. Whipple; m 1 Dec. 1840 to Benjamin Harrison.

Peachman purchased⁴ on 21 Dec. 1837 in Abbeviller Dist., SC, by two notes for total of \$3,000 from Henry M. Lipford for "cost of a negro boy named Nat, seventeen years old. A negro woman named Patty about twenty seven years old; a negro girl named Tilda about twenty three years of age. A negro woman named Sophy about 43 years of age. One bald bay horse about seven years old, one sorel mare about 10 years old, one blind boy stud horse about 8 yrs. Old. Two sorel mares each about two years old. A road wagon and harness, sixteen head of meat cattle, about twenty head of stock hogs and the usual Plantation tools."

Peachman Alford purchased on 22 Dec. 1843 39 9/12 acres including the Methodist meeting house where it now stands on line of counties of Monroe and Coneuch Co's, AL from Joseph M. Parmer. He is listed in the 1850 Esca. Co., FL and 1860 Mobile Co., Al censuses. He died in Mobile, Al in Aug. 1862 and Elizabeth died in Mobile on 24 Dec. 1861. Both buried in the New Magnolia Cemetery, Mobile, AL.

It is believed (no proof) that his mother was a Peachman. I find a Henry Peachman in the 1780 Augusta Co., VA Chronicles⁵ and a John Henry Peachman who purchased at a sale in Charleston Dist., SC on 22 Oct. 1821 as did Peachman Alford.⁶

I have NO PROOF of his family but believe he was a brother to my Wm. B. Alford, born ca 1803-06 in SC and brother to Elizabeth Alford, born ca 1808 in SC. Wm. B. was in Monroe Co., AL by 1842 and Elizabeth was in the 1850 Marion Co., SC census, as Eliz. Alford and 1860 Marion Co., SC as Eliz. Harrell. These three families are the ONLY Alford families in the United States that I have been able to find that carried the Peachman name from one generation to another.

2. (3). ELIZABETH (ALFORD) HARRELL born ca 1808 in Marion Co., SC, the name of her father is unknown but believe she is the sister of Peachman in the 1850 Marion Co., SC census as Eliz. Alford and 1860 Marion Co., SC census as Elizabeth Harrell.

2. (2). Our documented history starts with WILLIAM B. ALFORD, b. 1806 in SC; the name of his father is unknown. Harry "Big Harry" Alford said his grandfather married three times, he was a little Scotchman, wore a patch over one eye, and traveled between MS and TX. The last time he saw his grandfather was at the funeral of his brother, Julius Peachman Alford on 28 March 1901.

It is believed that the W. Allferd, born 1806 in NC, as listed in the 1860 Grimes Co., TX census, is old Wm. B. NO PROOF. According to Emma (Shropshire) Lay's Diary, "Mr. Alford and Harry came up from Cypress to visit

in Feb. and March 1865.7

If he lived to be 95 years old he should be in the 1870 thru 1900 censuses. I have checked the AL, MS, LA and TX censuses and have been unable to find William B. in any of them.

Harry "Little Harry" Alford said there were three graves on the old Alford place at one time. Probably William, Sarah and Georgianna??

Married 10 Nov. 1840 Monroe Co., AL to Sarah Ann (Snowden) Thames, daughter of William and Elizabeth Snowden and widow of William T. Thames, Sr.; she was born 22 Feb. 1806 in SC. Sarah and the children are listed in the 1855 School census of Grimes Co., TX, living next door to her son-in-law and daughter, Greene Roberts, Sr. Unable to find her in any census records of Texas.



John P. joined the Civil War at Anderson, Grimes Co., TX at age 17 as Pvt. In Capt. John R. Kennard's Co. (The Grimes Boys); Nelson's Regiment Texas Inf. Enrolled at (Fort Hebert) formerly VA Point, Galveston, TX on 13 Nov. 1861 as Pvt Co. A, 10th Regt Texas Infantry (also called Nelson's Regiment). Captured 11 Jan. 1863 at Arkansas Post. Confined at Camp Douglas, IL, 1 Aprl 1863 and delivered at City Point, VA on April 1863. Paroled at Camp Douglas, Il, Apr. 1863 and delivered at City Point, VA on 7 Apr. 1863 (sick in hospital). Absent sick on Company Muster Roll for convalescents employer in Cannon Hospital, La Grange, GA on 11 Jan. 1864 (3½ months had "debililas" sic.) Discharged at Headquarters, 16 Army Corps., Montgomery, AL during the month of May 1865.

According to Emma Shropshire's Diary, P. Alford visited them in Montgomery Co., TX from Aug. 31, 1864 thru Sept. 1864. He must have returned to AL as he m1 on 4 April 1865 at Monroe Co., AL to Martha A. Solomon, b. 1850 Monroe Co., Al, daughter of Tobias Solomon and Rebecca J. Feet.
