

A Visit to Aldford, England

Landon Alford AAFA #0002, and Bess Alford Rayford AAFA #0131, cousins from Henderson, TX, visited the town of Aldford, Cheshire County, when they were in England in March 1992. He is following the orderly sequence of forest practices outlined in the five-year management plan for his Tree Farm. Improvement cuts have been made on the land. Trees were marked or designated prior to cutting....

Henderson's Landon Alford Loop to Open

HENDERSON --- Landon Alford, who foresaw the need for a loop on Henderson's west side 27 years ago, will be honored Saturday when local officials open the Landon Alford Loop.

The ceremony will be held at 10 a.m. at the intersection of U.S. Highway 259 North and the new loop.

Keynote speaker for the event will be former Texas Department of Transportation executive director Arnold Oliver.

Other participants will include Tyler TxDOT District Engineer Mary May and former Tyler TxDOT District Engineer Bobby Evans.

Alford, the long-time chairman of the Rusk County Chamber of Commerce transportation committee, was influential in helping the city obtain TxDOT approval and funding for the loop.

He is a past chairman of the Texas Good Roads Association and a member of the East Texas/Gulf Highway Association.

Alford was named East Texan of the Year by the Texas Chamber of Commerce in 1984.

The first phase of the loop, which was recently completed, begins at U.S. 259 North and continues to State Highway 64.

The remaining two phases, which will connect the loop to U.S. 259 south of Henderson, have not been scheduled for construction.
