Obituary

Mrs. Jewell (Alford) Gallaugher, 85, 1664 S.W. Oak and widow of the late M.L. Gallaugher, died at 6:40 A.M. on Thursday in the Jane Phillips Episcopal Memorial Medical Center where she had been a patient for one day.

Funeral services for Mrs. Gallaugher will be held at 11:00 A.M. (Monday, March 26, 1990) in The Memory Chapel of The Arnold Moore Funeral Residence. The Rev. James H. Benton will be the officiant. The funeral cortege will drive overland to the Greenwood Cemetery, Sedan, Kansas where committal prayers and Interment will be directed by The Arnold Moore Funeral Service.

Jewell Alford was born November 2, 1904 on a farm near Sedan, Kansas in Chautauqua County. She was the daughter of the late George and Bentie (Scott) Alford. In 1914, she moved to Peru, Kansas with her family members where she completed her education and she was graduated with the Senior Class of 1922 from the Peru High School. She attended the Pittsburg State Teachers College and was graduated with a B.S. Degree in Education and she taught school for twenty years at Chautauqua and Peru, Kansas and Borger, Texas.

She and Major LeRoy Gallaugher were married on July 28, 1932 and they established their first home at Bushyhead, Oklahoma. In 1941, the Gallaughers moved to Chautauqua, Kansas where they both continued their teaching careers. The following year, they moved to Parsons, Kansas where Mr. Gallaugher was a Government Inspector for the Shell Loading Plant prior to his becoming a Research Chemist for the Research and Development Department for the Phillips Petroleum Company. Mr. and Mrs. Gallaugher came to Bartlesville in 1951 and he was retired in 1964 from the Phillips Petroleum Company. He preceded her in death here on May 16, 1978 and since that time Mrs. Gallaugher has continued living in Bartlesville in retirement.

Jewell A. Gallaugher was a member of the First Christian Church of which she was active in Christian Women's Fellowship, and the Christian Century Sunday School Class.

She was a member of the Daughters of the American Revolution and the United Daughters of the Confederacy. Mrs. Gallaugher was a former member of the Kansas Educational Society, the Texas Educational Society, the National Educational Society and the Parent-Teachers Association.

Mrs. Gallaugher will lie in state in the Drawing Rooms of The Arnold Moore Funeral Residence where friends may call for their visitation until the service hour.

Surviving Mrs. Gallaugher are four nephews, Robert Milligan, Scottsdale, Arizona, jerry Hill, Arlington, Virginia, Kenneth Alford, Eureka, Kansas and Gerald Alford, Independence, Kansas; three nieces, Mrs. Earl (Barbara) Doolin, Dallas, Texas, Miss Phyllis Alford, Coffeyville, Kansas and Miss Janet Alford, Bartlesville; several great nieces and nephews and great-great-nieces and nephews. She was preceded in death by two sisters, Mrs. Jean Young and Mrs. Pauline Hill and one brother, Ralph Alford.

AAFA Notes:

- 1. Jewell's Alford lineage: Georgia Jewell 1904 KS¹, George T. 1871 IN², Joseph McClure 1834 VA³, John 1795 VA⁴, John 1768 VA⁵, Thomas 1736 VA⁶, John 1696 ??⁷.
- 2. Jewell Alford Gallaugher was the first member known to have compiled a major Alford genealogy. The work, commonly known as "The Alford Sketch" was about the descendants of John Alford who died 1748 in Frederick County, VA and his wife Mary. That genealogy is now identified in AAFA as JOH696MD. Jewell, who admits to being a self-taught typist, probably completed the work in the 1970s and it was first published in two parts in the late Tressie Bowman's Alford Family Bulletin. Jewell later provided updates directly to AAFA.
