





Following the service this morning, committal will be to the left through the patio to the Columbarium area. Following the committal, you are invited to Colony Hall at the Indian River Colony Club for a time of refreshments and greeting the family.

Donald Ray Alford was born Oct. 5th, 1928 and passed away on June 29, 2014 in Melbourne, FL. He was born in Dierks, Arkansas (his parents were peach farmers and had an orchard in Nashville, Arkansas). He attended all his elementary and high school years in Dierks. He then went to Oklahoma Agricultural College for his first two years and then to University of Missouri in Columbia, MO where he received his Bachelor's Degree in Education. From there he enlisted in the Navy and became an Ensign and also served in the Korean Conflict. He returned to college at the University of Missouri and graduated with a Civil Engineering degree.

Don was a man of stability all of his life – someone who could be counted on to keep his commitments. That began with his wife – he and Joan were married 60 years ago on Sept. 11th, 1954. He worked really for one company all his life – AT&T – and that commitment took him all over the world. He was baptized at Holy Cross Lutheran Church in Kansas City and kept that commitment

to His Lord and Savior all his life.

The places he was "sent and worked" included: St. Louis, MO; Kansas City, MO; Manhattan, KS; Richmond, VA and Summit, NJ. He was under contract to the Defense Department and worked at establishing an "underground farm home" in Drainsville, VA. As an expert in military communications, he also worked with the military command in Arizona and California. When AT&T was being "broken up" he was in Chicago at those national discussions. He also was sent to Iran to work with the Shah before the events of the late 70's.

In retirement, he and Joan went back to Russellville, Arkansas to care for his parents (another commitment he fulfilled). They did love to travel – in their RV – in fact at one point living for six months in the RV traveling around the country. They even drove to Alaska – and had a "highlight of life" trip to Israel with Pastor Meyr and members of the church here in Viera. Along with his RV travels he was a very skilled and accomplished pilot. He flew a single-engine private airplane from the US all through Latin America with four adults onboard. Quite an accomplishment! In 1997, they moved to IRCC where they enjoyed many years of friends, activities, and church, both at Faith Viera Lutheran and at the Chapel. He is survived by his loving wife, Joan, sons, Evan and Brian Alford and 3 grandchildren. He is preceded in death by his daughter, Kara
