## FULL REPORT WAS PREPARED EXCERPTS ONLY WERE GIVEN - WITH COMMENTS-AT AAFA REUNION, OCT. 13, 1990, RALEIGH, N.C.

I AM NOT ONE FOR MAKING SPEECHES - IN FACT WILL PROBABLY HAVE A NERVOUS BREAKDOWN BY THE TIME I ARRIVE HOME FROM THE REACTION OF GIVING SAME.

ONE REASON - BESIDES SHOWING, OR PROVING, TO YOU THERE WAS ONLY THE ONE LODWICK ( there has been a controversy over the LODWICKS) - I WANTED TO GIVE THIS TODAY, OCTOBER 13, IT IS MY FATHER'S BIRTHDAY. HE WAS BORN OCTOBER 13,1860 AND DIED MAY, 1951. I THOUGHT HE MIGHT LIKE, AND APPROVE, THIS AND IT COULD BE MY MEMORIAL TO HIM.

WITH THE HELP OF JEAN SHEARIN, JAMES SORRELS AND BILL MITCHINER, ALL COUSINS, AND LOUISE FULLER. I HAVE COME UP WITH THE FOLLOWING INSTRUMENTS. I AM TAKING THE LINE ON DEEDS AND DATES AS I DO NOT BELIEVE THIS HAS BEEN DONE BEFORE. THIS INCLUDES SIGNATURES ON THE INSTRUMENTS.

SOME OF YOU WILL BE BORED, I AM SURE, BUT WHAT I AM TRYING TO DO IS CLEAR UP THE PROBLEMS THAT HAVE ARISEN OVER THE YEARS IN TRYING TO KEEP LODWICKS SEPARATED. SOME OF YOU MIGHT HAVE SIMILAR PROBLEMS IN YOUR LINE WHERE TWO PEOPLE CARRY THE SAME NAME, AND IN THE SAME TIME PERIOD.

FIRST, I WOULD LIKE TO SHOW YOU A MAP OF VIRGINIA -Gilbert ran the projector - I HAVE MARKED NEW KENT COUNTY, VIRGINIA, AND THEN YOU WILL SEE EDGECOMBE PRECINCT DOWN AT THE BOTTOM OF THE MAP. THE ROANOKE RIVER RUNS FROM VIRGINIA ACROSS INTO NORTH CAROLINA, BETWEEN EDGECOMBE PRECINCT AND NORTHAMPTON COUNTY. LODWICK MORE THAN LIKELY CAME DOWN THE INDIAN TRADING PATHS WHICH HAD BECOME ROADS AS PEOPLE MIGRATED SOUTH AND WEST. ONE PATH IN PARTICULAR COULD HAVE BEEN GREEN PATH. IT RAN NORTH AND SOUTH CROSSING THE ROANOKE RIVER ABOVE THE FALLS (which were in HALIFAX area). IF YOU HAVE EVER SEEN A MAP OF INDIAN TRAILS YOU KNOW THE PATHS CROSSED AND CRISS-CROSSED FROM FLORIDA TO PENNSYLVANIA. ANOTHER PATH WAS THE CHEREKEE-CATAWBA THIS CROSSED THE ROANOKE, SEEMINGLY IN THE SAME AREA AS GREEN PATH, AND THEN MEANDERED OFF TO THE SOUTHWEST IN NORTH CAROLINA. AS STATED BEFORE, IT WOULD SEEM MORE LIKELY LODWICK CAME DOWN THE GREEN PATH.

LODWICK PROBABLY ARRIVED IN NORTH CAROLINA 1739. THEN THE YEARS WERE FROM MARCH TO MARCH, NOT JANUARY TO JANUARY AS WE KNOW TODAY. HE PROBABLY RENTED HIS FIRST LAND, AND EVEN COULD HAVE RENTED THE LAND HE LETER BOUGHT.

I UNDERSTAND THAT EDGECOMBE WAS A PRECINCT OF BERTIE COUNTY, AND GOVERNED BY BERTIE.

AS I GO INTO DEEDS YOU WILL NOTE HAVE TRIED TO FOLLOW CONSECUTIVE, YEARS, TRYING TO MATCH DESCRIPTIONS. ERRORS COULD BE MADE. IF SO, WILL GLADLY CORRECT IF ANYONE HAS DIFFERENT INFORMATION


1705 was so cold that Albermarle Sound, at Edenton, was frozen over.
1705 the first church in North Carolina was established in CHOWAN COUNTY.

(In 1720 a town which had for sometime been established, was called, in honow of the Governor Charles Eden, EDENTON. EDENTON, the county seat of CHOWAN COUNTY



"1712 the Indians were fortified on the banks of Newse, in the present County of Craven, about eighteen miles west of NEWBERN. Here they received the attack of the whites. They were defeated with great slaughter; more than three hundred savages killed, one hundred made prisoners.

"Governor Hyde died of yellow fever 1712."

Page 45 & 46:

Adward Richards 152 8 acres Chas. City Co. So. side James River 26 Sept 1674 p. 529. Below the Pond Nigh head of Ward's Fack. adj. Thomas Morgan & his own land, down the Boggy Pr. nigh a small Indian field &c 750 acres granted Jno. Westrape 30 Aug. 1650 and sold to John Praves & Thos. Morgan 29 July 1653 by sd Morgan sold to Richards 10 Jan. 1654 778 acres for trans. 16 pers. Wm. Jones, Thos. Alford and --- others.

It has been stated many times a person would go back out then return on another ship in order to give the owner more land. Is this what happened by a Thos. Alford, in order to get more land?

Pa e 69:

Mosses Run 29 April 1692 p.238 on head of Peas-hills, dividing this land now or later of Thomas Cole, on Queen Creek run otherwise c lled Old Tree Run, to land now or late, or Mr. Harwood, &c 300 acs. granted "m. Penard, Ppr. 1688 who assigned to sd. Hunt; 608 ace for imp. of 13 pers.



CLORDS PROPRIETORS consisted of charters given to 8 Lords. All relinquished to English Crown by 1729 withexception of Lord Cartaret, Earl of Granville. Lord Granvilles boundaries were established by 1741? Some lands in the area had been sold by the State of N.C.)
