95-year-old Albany resident in Alford Hall of Fame

ALBANY—Haidee Kathleen Alford Reeves was honored Ot. 29 at her home in Albany. Mrs. Reeves celebrated her 95th birthday [on Saturday]. She is a charter member of the Alford American Family Association and was inducted into the Alford Hall of Fame by that organization when it held its annual meeting October 11–13 in Springfield, Mo.

Mrs. Reeves who has long been active in the local Daughters of the American Revolution organization and genealogical pursuits of Florida Parish families, was one of those instrumental in getting the AAFA established.

She was inducted into the Hall of Fame primarily for her outstanding work in recruiting and involving new members.

Though confined to a wheelchair from the inception of the association she has been more successful in recruiting than just about any other member.

A number of those recruited by her—living all over the United States—are faithful in attending each annual meeting of the association which meets in a different state each year.

The association has over 150 member families in Louisiana with about 30 in Baton Rouge which include Mrs. Reeves' son Paul Reeves and Mrs Richard Stoewer who represented AAFA management in making the award at the ceremony.

Some local members are Dr. C.D. "Bo" [Alford], Mrs. Yvonne Alford, widow of the late Eulon Alford who was very active in the association, Hughie R. Alford, Paul W. Alford, O.C. Winburn, Willie Joe Alford, Helen Alford Bankston and in Denham Springs Carlton E. Spiers, Arthur Alford, and Bernita G. Smith.
