Walter Hoyle Alford born in 1908 along with his twin brother Haskell were the first of the ten children born to their parents William Leorus Haywood and Lucy Mell Overby Alford, Born in rural Worth County in the southwestern part of Georgia, the boys grew up doing the usual chores around the farm and my father's turpentine stills and received their early education in the country schools of the time. Later, in the mid to late 1920's the boys started attending high school in Sylvester, the county seat. But by this time the great depression of the United States was already in full swing in Georgia. It came early to Georgia because of the cotton boll weevil and the bottom dropping out of the turpentine/naval stores industry. The latter was incident to the influx of German chemical patents after World War I. My father lost everything.

It was genteel poverty in the large but proud Alford family. There was good, wholesome food from the farm but cash income of my father as a real estate broker was quite inadequate. It

was sort of hand-to-mouth living on plenty of food and hand-me-down clothes from relatives. The twins Haskell and Hoyle volunteered to quit school, go off to Jacksonville, Florida to find work and send money home so we younger children could continue school. My mother was heart-brokenshe wanted so hard to educate all her children. It was a tearful farewell when the twins were put on the train for Jacksonville. It was the only time I ever saw my father cry. Haskell and Hoyle lived with an older half-brother and his family in Jacksonville and did indeed send money home faithfully every month. They worked at several thingsdriving trucks, clerking in grocery stores, cutting meat in butcher shops and apprentice jobs for railroads. For awhile the twins lived with another half-brother in Lakeland, Florida, Later returning to Jacksonville, Hoyle made two more stabs at returning to Sylvester and attending high school where he was an outstanding guard on the football team. While he was not a small man, he was of medium stature compared to some of the burly football players. But he was a feisty, gutsy player who took no guff from any one. Alas, in the 11th grade and winter coming on, his handme-down shoes wore out and there was no money to buy new ones. He returned to Jacksonville without his diploma.

During the 1930's Hoyle Alford married Dorothy Horne of Jacksonville and settled on a career in railroad dining car service. When war came he was drafted but his dining car service on troop trains was deemed essential war work. Hoyle and his wife Dorothy were the parents of two fine daughters who were educated into advanced degrees and useful careers in teaching. But Hoyle himself was a self-educated, selfmade man of many talents-an avid flower and vegetable gardener, piano player, fisherman and philosopher. Quiet and softspoken he was a devoted husband and father- a true gentlemen of the old school. In my mind he was truly a magnificent Alford. There is no question in my mind that the sacrifice of the high school education of my twin brothers Haskell and Hoyle Alford made it possible for my education and successful career in the Navy. I will forever be indebted to them. Haskell died in 1967. Hoyle died in 1997 just a few months short of his 90th birthday. RIP!
