one thousand eight hundred & eighteen before
me the subscriber one of the ^{Judges of the} Court of Common
Pleas of Onida County personally appearing John
Olford aged twenty eight in the month of Septe-
mber next, resident in Rome in the County of
said, who being by me first duly sworn according
to Law doth on his oath, make the following de-
claration in order to obtain the provision made
by the late act of Congress, entitled "an act to
provide for certain persons engaged in the
land and naval service of the United States in
the revolutionary war." That the said John
Olford enlisted in Herington in the County of
Litchfield in the State of Connecticut in the Com-
pany commanded by Captain Halbert of the town
of New Hartford County & State as aforesaid, and
was attached to the Regiment commanded by Col.
Burrill, for the term of one year; that after
the expiration of the aforesaid term he enlisted again
in to the Company commanded by Capt. Porter of
Herington County & State as aforesaid, for three
years, and was attached to the Regiment command-
ed by Col. Hays as a wagoner and drew the team
pay & was treated in other respects as a soldier
bearing arms; That he continued to serve in

State of New York, Onondaga Common Pleas September term 1820.
Onondaga County ss: On this 8th day of September 1820 personally
appeared in open court, being a court of record for said county,
John Alford - aged eighty two - resident in Camden in said
county: who being duly sworn doth declare that he served in
the revolutionary war as follows to wit in Col. Bunnells Regt.
Connecticut line, in Capt. Halletts company for one year.

That he applied for a pension on the 16th day of July 1818
which was granted & the certificate of the same is No 12.632

And I do solemnly swear that I was a resident citizen
of the United States on the 18th day of March 1818, and
I have not since that time by gift sale or in any manner
disposed of my property or any part thereof with intent thereby
so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions
of an act of Congress entitled "An act to provide for certain
persons engaged in the land & naval service of the United
States in the revolutionary war" passed on the 18th March
1818: and I have not, nor has any person in trust for
me any property or securities, contracts or debts, due to me:
nor have I any income other than what is contained in
the schedule hereunto annexed & by me subscribed
Sworn to the 8th day of September 1820 before J. Bacon Judge of
Onondaga Com Pleas

County of Bradford personally appeared John Alfred
who on his oath, declares that he is the same person
who formerly belonged to the Company Commanded by
Captain Aurlin in the Regiment Commanded by
Colonel Purcell in the Service of the United States;
that his name was placed on the pension roll of the State
of New York from whence he has lately removed; that he
now resides in Canton, Pennsylvania, where he intends to
remain, and wishes his pension to be there payable in
future. The following are his reasons for removing from Cass
County, State of New York to Canton Bradford
County Penna. — For many years previous to his leaving
Oriskany County New York he lived with his son in law,
Martin Tyler. He the said Martin Tyler having children residing
in this County was induced to remove here and he has to accompany
him and subscribed to
